Dear Friends in Christ,

Grace and peace to you. The Apostle Paul began all but 2 of his 13 New Testament letters with that same simple greeting: "Grace and peace to you." It seems like a simple greeting. And yet those two words summarize the whole Gospel message. You can sum up everything that Paul wrote in just those 2 words: grace and peace.

First, grace. Grace is the free gift of God's saving love. We do nothing to deserve it. It comes to us not because we are good but because God is good. Grace is love for the unlovely. Grace tells us the truth about our sin and then gives us the gift of God's forgiveness. Grace is the gift that makes life worth living. Grace came to us in the gift of the one and only Son of God.

Then, the gift of grace produces the second word: peace. We are born into a rebellion against God. We are born fighting against God and God is fighting against us to save us from ourselves. We didn't learn to rebel against God. Sin just came naturally to our corrupted human nature. But grace declares an end to our warfare against God. Despite our continued struggle with sin and selfishness, because of God's grace we know that God is our best friend.

Grace and peace. That is the good news of the Gospel of Jesus. It is that simple. Even a little child can understand it. And yet grace and peace are also incredibly profound. Paul didn't stop his letters with that simple greeting of grace and peace. Paul then went on to explain what that grace and peace means for our lives as Christians in this complex, confusing, and challenging world. Learning to live by grace and learning to live in our peace with God is a lifelong challenge.

We sinners can find plenty of ways to complicate what should be very simple. The Lutheran movement was really all about trying to get back to the simple basics of grace and peace in the Gospel. And the Protestant Reformation after Luther has been all about trying to make it complicated again in different ways.

It isn't easy in this conflicted world to keep our focus on the main thing. But what I am looking for each week as we gather in worship is to have my life focused on the simple basics of life: grace and peace. I so easily get distracted by all the other things that the world says are so important. But a simple reminder for an hour each week of the grace and peace of the Gospel is just what I need keep my focus in life, to keep myself centered and balanced. I hope that you find the same thing in our worship life together at Immanuel.

MARCH COUNCIL MEETING SUMMARY

The Immanuel Church Council met March 12 with 12 of 13 members present. Joey Hansen led devotions from Max Lucado. April devotions will be led by Craig Olson.

John Taggs, Eric Chipman, Rich & Barb Furst, Joey Hansen, Vicki Strissel, and Craig Olson volunteered for Sunday morning deacon duties.

Treasurer's Report: February income was \$20,483 and expenses were \$35,775 leaving us with a negative of \$14,906 for the year. We paid our annual insurance premium of \$11,803. General Fund is balance is \$75,617 and the capital savings balance is \$69,154.

TZ Report: Immanuel and Kidugala are approaching the 20-year anniversary of our partnership in 2025. TZ team would like to invite 2-3 ambassadors to Immanuel. This would be our 4th time hosting. Funding would be through the TZ Travel Fund at \$3000-3500 per person in cost. Ambassadors would be here for 2-3 weeks. Also, Well #10 is almost complete and Well #11 fund goal has been met and the drilling has started.

Outreach/Stewardship – Food Pantry contribution is up to 229 pounds. March Mission was Salvation Army for \$2,150. April Mission pending. SW Iowa Mobile Food Pack sent an appeal to raise \$30k for a Harlan event Oct. 11-12.

Property – Ken installed a new handicap toilet in handicap restroom. Service call scheduled on kitchen garbage disposal. Elevate Roofing repaired a hole that caused a leak. Looks like crows have been pecking. Discussed an outdoor clean-up date for this year in June.

Pastor's Report – Jared Walters is planning to study for ordained LCMC ministry. Pastor asked for approval of Jared Walters participating in a Baptism. We discussed Lutheran theology and practice regarding Baptism and Communion. Council approved request with Pastor providing oversight and information to the congregation. Jared will also be leading worship in April, May, and June when Pastor is unavailable. Pastor also invited Evan Nielsen to share his experiences with YWAM in New Zealand as the sermon for July 20-21.

Pastor is still working on a Photo directory. A member has donated funds to ILC through a stock transfer to avoid capital gains taxes. Perhaps other members should be educated about the advantages and the process. The Mission Quilters donated a beautiful quilt for the TZ Auction and it disappeared from the auction tables. We will file a police report and keep other items secured during the week.

Old Business – It was suggested that we should pull out every other Yew hedge from the front sidewalk to improve the appearance.

New Business – It was suggested that we should welcome our new attendees from South Sudan with a dinner meeting to explore ways that ILC can be of assistance to them in Harlan.

SECRETARY'S REPORT: The minutes reviewed with no corrections. Motion to approve by Jean, seconded by Sharon. Ayes all.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Kathy reported the audit was completed and all is OK. Income received (\$575) from 4 funerals (Hansen, Kumm, Brue and Olson). Jan Applegate was reimbursed \$102.48 for placemats. February ending balance is \$2166.83. Jean presented 2 bills--\$34.24 for baskets for sugar/creamer packets and \$430.13 for gold imprinted napkins. ILCW GATHERING

Sandy opened the Gathering with 18 ladies attending. Ann Holt served delicious refreshments with a Spring flower theme and gave out flower seed packets to welcome Spring. Linda Mosher gave a reading on "Memories and Hope". The best memory we should have is saying "yes to God." She also read an original poem written by Sandy Stormer titled the "Country Girl." Linda's program was on "feed sacks". The tables displayed about 2 dozen feed sacks belonging to Dolly Burgin. Three beautiful quilts were also displayed made from feed sacks that belong to Leroy and Phyllis Larsen. The sacks came from Leroy's parents' home that had been stored in the attic for years. The first feed sacks were made of cotton in the 1840's by slave labor. Later some were also made of jute or burlap. In the 1880s logos were placed on the sacks. In the 1930's the sacks were used to store everything from chicken feed to flour. During that time, it was estimated that 3 million people wore clothing made from feed sacks. The "postage stamp" guilt was named because of tiny pieces of scrap feed sack material was used to make yet another quilt! The feed sack era ended in 1964. Fun and informative program Linda!

Quail and Manna (aka chicken gnocchi)

Disclaimer: NO QUAIL WERE HARMED IN THE MAKING OF THIS SOUP!!

- 3-4 boneless skinless chicken breasts, cooked and shredded
- 1-2 stalks of celery, chopped
- 1 large sweet onion, chopped
- 2 Tablespoons minced garlic
- 1 cup shredded carrots
- 4 Tablespoons butter
- 4 cups chicken broth
- 16 oz. Potato gnocchi
- 2 tsp cardamom
- 1 Tablespoon Hidden Valley Ranch seasoning
- 2 tsp. Thyme
- 2 cups half & half
- 1 cup fresh spinach, roughly torn
- 1. Sauté onion until onions are nearly translucent. Add garlic, celery and carrots, continue to sauté until carrots are soft.
- 2. Add chicken, chicken broth, and seasoning. Bring to a boil and add gnocchi. Once gnocchi have floated to the top, add cream and spinach.
- 3. Simmer for about 10 minutes or until desired consistency is reached.

According to Moses, nobody is to keep this overnight, but we have found this modern version keeps well for leftovers the next day just fine if you add a little more broth.
