Humble Beginnings

"The Past": For most of my Christian life, until nearly a year ago, my walk with God was purely based on gathered information and trivial knowledge. God did not have my whole heart, and what parts He did have, were given out of habit and traditional ritual – "...because that's what every other Christian says or does, so I guess I must also..." But on October 23rd, 2023, my perspective and position on my relationship with God changed forever as He began to reveal how big and awesome He truly is.

'Youth With A Missions (YWAM)' offered me the space to truly take my faith seriously, to ask the hard questions, either become rooted in God whole heartedly or turn away from Him completely. YWAM was my first taste of missions' work, the good, the bad, and the ugly of it. In total I spend 9 months abroad chasing after God, developing our relationship to a deeper level.

"The Present": Within the latter 3 months of my time in YWAM during a Discipleship Bible Course, my eyes became open to the depth of the Scriptures, the vast complexity of layers to be discovered, and the beauty of learning about God through His own Word especially within community and fellowship. It was within this school I began to pray on becoming a teacher for God's Word.

Now I begin my journey on becoming a teacher of biblical studies and have applied to staff within YWAM at their base in Denver, CO with the intention to teach within the organization of 'Youth With A Mission' globally across their countless bases, educating and equipping the young generation for the missionary field.

This month of August is my month of raising support for staffing as all position within YWAM are considered missionary work ('volunteer'). If God has put it on your heart to help aid my walk with God as a missionary, here are a few ways you can lend a helping hand:

<u>Prayer and Spiritual</u>: Often the best way to help is by being a prayer warrior for others. For this month I would greatly appreciate prayer for Patience in God's timing, to be able to rely more on His will and plans than on my own understanding, and to seek His guidance in my walk.

<u>Financial Giving</u>: If financial giving is how you have decided to help, the best way to donate is through my page on "Equipnet.org".

By whatever means you decide to support my work in God's missions, be sure to partner with God in it and give from the heart. Every little bit helps and is greatly appreciated.

"The Future": The Goal is to start in Denver, CO in September of this year and staff with them up to 2025. If no opportunities present themselves for me to continue with Denver, then the idea would be to return to Pacific Reach in New Zealand in April, after my March Mission-Outreach trip in Nepal.

A little history lesson: I became a member of Immanuel in 1972, as a new teacher in the Harlan Community Schools. I taught 5th grade at Westridge Elementary. Being raised Lutheran, I sought out Immanuel as my church family. The first person to greet me on my first Sunday was Willard Olson. What a welcoming human being, then right with him, of course, was Marg. They put me at ease and I knew I was in the right congregation. Immanuel was looking for a choir director, and I just said, "I'd try," as I am not a music major, just a minor who has her limits, still true to this day, even after 40 years of choir and handbell directing. It is a bit ironic that I started directing in 1972, and now at age 72, (very soon to be that

I love church music. That is pretty much it. What else is really important? (My first solo was in the church at age 8, singing "In the Cross of Christ Glory") I believe worship through song. The Psalms are a great example of that. The "Messiah," Bible based, down to "Jesus Loves Me, This I Know." What better words are there put to music?

The chuch choir is becoming an element of worship services that is dwindling in great numbers. 40% of churches, overall, have lost or given up their choirs. What a shame, and what a BLESS-ING Immanuel has!!! 23 people that enjoy sharing their talent, their voices, their time, their love of music and one another!

A church choir encourages one another, and we DO have those people who say, "you're doing great," "you can do it," "that was so pretty," and an occasional, "Craig, what did you just do?" We have fun at our rehearsals, no one takes themselves too seriously.

A church choir celebrates the human voice. What a gift for all of us to speak, to communicate, and in music, to worship through song. A choir praises God and hopefully, touches your heart, and brings a congregation a moment with God. A church choir shares its talent and works together for the enrichment of a church service.

In a church choir, the young and the old and the "in-betweens" all sing together and learn from each other. What a gift that is!

In closing, without a congregation, there would be no choir at Immanuel. A HUGE thank you to all of the present choir members, and a HUGE invitation to any of you who have a desire to sing, to be part of a church group, to have some fun and to send a message to our congregation once a month.

For my part, I will do my best to select meaningful and doable music, to be enthusiastic, (easy job) and to always remember that we are part of this church, we sing to the Lord and we pray He enjoys what he hears. Thank you to the Worship Committee and choir members for asking me to take on this task...

Breaking news! An invitation letter is being sent out from Immanuel to the Kidugala parish inviting two ambassadors from the Kidugala region to join us next summer in the celebration of the twentieth-year anniversary of our mission partnership between Immanuel and Kidugala, Tanzania. This is a developing story, and we look forward to sharing related upcoming events.

We recently learned that our zeri rafiki (very good friend) Pastor Lova passed away last week. Pastor Lova had previously visited Immanuel for a week with Pastor Nodfred. Pastor Lova was the pastor of several parishes in the Southern District of Tanzania over his many years of church service. He also held positions in the district office as well as the position of rector of the Kidugala Seminary. Over the years the travel teams have enjoyed his hospitality and have recently visited his new home in Kidugala.

We have a new parish pastor in Kidugala! Pastor Yuaja Mgeni has moved onto another parish and Kidugala's new pastor is Neto Msigwa. We have spoken with Neto and have emailed him a few times and we have discovered his English is excellent. We look forward to meeting him on our next trip.

On our last trip to Kidugala we sat down with Pastor Sebastian who has currently been assigned to a parish near Kidugala. Sebastian was the parish pastor in Kidugala several years ago and we have kept in contact with him since them. When the travel team was in Kidugala in August of 2023 we got together and had a lot of laughs and great conversation. During the conversation Sebastian spoke of a parish sponsored handicapped children's school that would soon be holding a fundraiser.


A month or two after returning from our August 2023 mission trip a private donor approached the Tanzanian team with funds that he wanted to use for mission work in Tanzania. He asked us to decide how to use them in the most beneficial way that we could, possibly in another village that has needs. We couldn't think of a better way to use those funds than to finish off the handicap school fundraiser shortfall, support 34 primary orphans and 18 secondary orphans as well as distribute Bibles to 163 confirmation students!

I love it when HIS plan comes together! I spoke with Pastor Sebastian today. He said several items had been purchased for the handicap school, the confirmation class Bibles had been distributed and the orphans are being assisted. Since that conversation I have received several pictures from Sebastian. This too could be another developing story and indeed another cause for celebration! Stay tuned!
