



Advent 2021 Dear Friends in Christ,

Happy New Year! November 28 marked the beginning of a new liturgical year in the Church. We begin a new year of worship with the season of Advent. While the calendar year has 4 seasons, the Church year has 6 seasons.

Advent includes the 4 Sundays before Christmas. While the world is rushing to celebrate its own commercial version of Christmas, Advent reminds us that faith involves waiting and living in hope. In Advent we recall how God prepared his people for the coming of the Messiah. We also recall how we continue to live in hope for the fulfillment of all that Jesus began. The mood of Advent is expectation. I look forward to singing "Wake, Awake for Night Is Flying."

Christmas is the 12 days from December 25 to January 5. In Biblical thinking, each day begins with sunset. Therefore, Christmas begins on Christmas Eve as we recall that the birth of Jesus was announced to shepherds who were watching their flocks by night. For 12 days we celebrate the humanity and the humility of God's coming among us. The mystery of the Incarnation (God become human) and Immanuel (God with us) are the core of our faith. The mood of Christmas is wonder. I look forward to singing all those glorious Christmas carols.

Epiphany always begins January 6. Epiphany means shining forth or revealing. During the weeks of Epiphany we focus on the glory of God shining forth in the words and works of Jesus. Epiphany begins with the baptism of Jesus marking the beginning of Jesus' public ministry. Epiphany ends with the transfiguration of Jesus on the mountain marking the beginning of his journey to the cross. The mood of Epiphany is surprise. I look forward to singing "O Morning Star, How Fair and Bright."

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday which this year will be March 2. Lent focuses on Jesus' journey to the cross and our call to follow Jesus in dying to self. During the 40 days plus Sundays we focus on the passion and the cross of Jesus. We remember our sin and our need for repentance. Lent ends with the high drama of Holy Week. The mood of Lent is somber. I look forward to singing "Were You There?" in the darkened sanctuary on Good Friday.

Easter will be April 17 this year. During the 50 days of rejoicing we celebrate the resurrection as our sneak peek into the future of Christ's total victory over sin and death. As the world greens up around us, we celebrate the ways that we experience the promise of Easter in our daily lives. The mood of Easter is joy. I look forward to singing all the "alleluia" songs.

Pentecost will be June 5 this year. Pentecost focuses on the Holy Spirit's work calling, gathering, enlightening, sanctifying, and keeping us through the gifts of Word and Church. During this long green season we focus on our growth in faith and love.

Pastor's Notes Continued....

A few years ago I wrote a Sunday School song to teach the seasons of the Church year. The verses of the song were as follows:

Advent brings God's promise near. Celebrate! Celebrate! Christmas means God's gift is here. Emmanuel!

Healing, teaching, surprising all, celebrate! Celebrate! Epiphany shows Jesus' call. Glory to God!

Jesus came to find the lost. Celebrate! Celebrate! Lent leads us to the cross. Hosanna!

On the third day Christ did rise. Celebrate! Celebrate! Easter is the hope of life! Hallelujah!



The Spirit's power makes us grow! Celebrate! Celebrate! Pentecost give power to go! Thanks be to God!

Each season focuses us on an important element of the life of faith. Each season has a distinct message and mood. Together the seasons help us maintain a balance and a fullness in our Christian experience. So don't miss out on any of the seasons of the new year.

Greeters + Ushers = Worship Hosts

Immanuel Church asks all of our able-bodied members to serve in some way to support our ministry of worship. Members are commonly asked to serve as greeters or ushers. Greeters provide a positive and welcoming first impression for everyone entering the building. Ushers see that worshipers have everything they need to participate in worship. Ushers also bring the offering forward for the presentation of the offering. Ushers also count and record the number of people worshiping.

Presently we don't recommend that greeters shake hands and we don't have ushers passing the offering plates around. So we are going to try combining the roles of greeters and ushers into one role called "worship hosts". These greeter/ushers can stand where greeters have always stood and welcome people with greetings and smiles and handing out a program rather than shaking hands. Other ushers can provide a second greeting at the main door to the sanctuary. We can never have too much greeting, especially for guests and new comers.



COUNCIL MEETING SUMMARY November 9, 2021—7 pm

The Immanuel Church Council met November 9 with 9 of 12 members present. Ivy Nielsen led devotions from Isaiah 41:10. God calls us to live without fear. Cheryl Chipman will lead devotions in December.

Eric Chipman, Derek Chapman, John Taggs, George Applegate, Peg Haas, and Cheryl Chipman volunteered for Sunday morning Council duties.

Treasurer: October income was only \$13,461. We missed a weekend offering. October expenses were \$21,510. General Fund ended October at \$30,496. Ted Williams funds are at \$25,994. Capital Savings are at \$49,159.

Worship/Evangelism: Seth Johannsen gave a brief presentation on the pipe organ situation. He is in contact with the company that built our organ. He is also researching digital replacements for our organ. The council will have to make a recommendation to the congregation about how to proceed.

Outreach/Stewardship: 824 pounds have been donated to the food pantry. Tanzania Committee is working to get seed corn from Dr. Jerry Strissel to Tanzania. Immanuel will serve at the Iowa Community Kitchen again this December.

Property: We have contracted for snow removal this winter at \$350 per storm.


