

Fifteen years ago, when we started collecting recyclable cans and bottles for projects with Kidugala, Tanzania, we collected 18,000 in a year. This year we are just 12,000 short of reaching 200,000 recyclable cans and bottles for 2023. That would be \$10,000 for our projects with Kidugala. Can you help us reach this new plateau? Bring in your cans and bottles before December 19. If we reach this goal, we will have created \$48,000 over the past 15 years for Christian mission in Tanzania. We are on pace to reach this goal with your help.

NOVEMBER COUNCIL MEETING SUMMARY

The Immanuel Church Council met November 14 with all 13 members present.

Steve Allen led devotions with the "Ufdah sayings" of Jesus: Be perfect. Love everybody. Love your enemies. How do we love our enemies the way God loved his enemies (us)? December devotions will be led by Joey Hansen.

Treasurer: October income was \$22,919 and expenses were \$18,643. General Fund balance on November 1 was \$79,836. Capital Savings Account is at \$65,080. Organ Fund is at \$28,272. TZ Account is at \$32,209.

Worship/Evangelism: The organ is on schedule for completion by the beginning of December. An organ dedication is scheduled for February 11 with a guest organist from Omaha Chapter of the American Guild of Organists. We have recruited a couple of new sound and camera team members. Looking for a few more members for the Worship/Evangelism committee.

Fellowship/Education: Christmas Decorating party scheduled. Children's Christmas Program and Caroling scheduled for December 17.

Outreach/Stewardship: Our December Mission Partners are Tartu Academy in Estonia, Spiritual Orphan Network in Eastern Europe, and the prison congregations in Rockwell City and Fort Dodge. Organized a Gratitude Sunday. Collected Winter Wear for West Central. Sharing Cupboard is being well used. Thanks to Hansen House for providing so many meals. An offering for "The Chosen" is being collected.

Property: Outdoor decorations will be put up again this year. Vicki lined up a lift.

Executive: Committee carried out employee reviews. Connie Boysen has announced that she will be resigning as our office administrator so that she can farm full time. We will begin seeking our next office administrator. Nominating Committee is working on nominations for next year's Council and Trust Committee. Budget process is beginning. Annual meeting was set for Sunday, January 28.

SECRETARY'S REPORT: Motion by Jean and seconded by Kathy to approve the October minutes. Ayes all.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Kathy gave breakdown of Harvest Bazaar income and expenses. Net proceeds were \$4516.52 leaving the October balance of \$6183.07.

COMMITTEES: Community: Sharon reported 25 Super Senior bags were ready for delivery. She will ask for volunteers at the Gathering to get them delivered.

TANZANIA HAPPENINGS

Pies for the Holidays! The Tanzania Team and a tremendous group of helpers have been busy making pies. We have apple, cherry, or rhubarb at \$14 a pie. They are available after church or ask in the church office during the week. All proceeds go to fund the orphans in Kidugala to attend school. Immanuel is currently funding over 200 primary and secondary school orphans. Thank you for your support!

Christmas Gift Idea: Do you have a person on your Christmas list that you need an idea for a gift? How about helping an orphan in Kidugala with a uniform for school? For a donation of \$25, an orphan can have a uniform, or for a \$40 donation an orphan can have a uniform and school fees for a year. Christmas cards are available to inform the recipient of your gift in their name. This year we also have cards for gifts of donations of any amount, for helping to sponsor wells. These cards are available during the month of December in the church office. Checks can be made out to ILC Tanzania. Thank you.

During the November 4th and 5th services I enjoyed announcing that our funding goal had been reached to drill Immanuel's 10th well in Tanzania and our second attempt at shipping maize seed to Iringa Hope was underway. As of this writing, a major portion of the funds for the well were sent a few days ago into the Kidugala HEAD bank account, but the drilling team has not arrived in the Masalwa area yet. The balance of the funds will be sent depending on the success of the drilling and the pump type chosen for the project.


Also spoken about during the service was the second attempt to get a test sample of our own Dr. Jerry Strissel's maize seed into Iringa Hope. Three high protein, high oil seed varieties left for Miami on its way to Iringa, Tanzania a couple weeks ago by way of the East African Seed Company in South Africa. It is interesting to me that Venance, the man in charge of the testing of seed at Iringa Hope, has designated 4 of the 5 plots to be in or near the Kidugala area and the fifth to be 4 hours north in the Iringa area. We will be watching this project since it has potential to boost agricultural production in the region. Certainly, there aren't any guarantees that these varieties will outperform the varieties that they are currently planting, but we won't know until tested in the region and quite possibly for more than one year. Even if these plots are successful, we won't get any results until June 2024 at the earliest. Stay tuned.

The Tanzanian team wishes to thank all the members of Immanuel for its continued support of this international mission. There is so much to talk about when considering what has and is happening with the relationship between Kidugala and Immanuel. The travel teams throughout the years have been eyewitnesses to what God has been doing through Immanuel in the Kidugala region. We hope to bring this witness back to Immanuel through the Ambassador visits, the "Insights" articles, congregational reports, and personal conversations. If you have questions for the Tanzanian Committee, please feel free to ask. The date of the next trip has not been set, but if you are interested and able to travel or wish to join the Tanzanian Team, please let one of the members know.
