Dear Friends in Christ,

Happy Holidays! That has become a standard December greeting in the United States. We have become a culture so afraid of the name of Christ that we don't dare to use the word "Christmas" publicly. The name of Christ has always made people nervous. People feel free to talk about God because everybody can define God any way they like. But to talk about Christ is to claim that the true God entered human history in the person of his Son. Wishing someone a Merry Christmas does run the risk of offending a few people because you are telling them that you believe the true God is the One who revealed Himself in the person of Jesus.

I think it is a good thing that some atheists and others are recognizing that Christmas is not just a meaningless winter holiday. Christmas is the celebration of God's invasion into our world. I wish all Christians took Christmas as seriously as some atheists do.

A few secularists have declared war on Christmas. We shouldn't be surprised. December 25 was an old pagan holiday before the ancient Church redeemed the day for the celebration of the Mystery of the Incarnation. Now the world wants that old holiday back. Puritans and Pilgrims thought we should give December 25 back to the world. However, most of us Christians don't want to give Christmas back. It is one time of the year when the world looks at Jesus and wonders "what if it is true?"

Some Christians are offended when people wish them "Happy Holidays." They feel like the world is trying to erase Christmas. But someone suggested that when someone wishes you "happy holidays," we should smile and say, "Thank you. And what holiday do you celebrate?" That response invites someone into a spiritual conversation and opens up an opportunity for them to ask you about what holiday you celebrate. You can then tell them about God's gift of love in Jesus. You can't be offending them because they are the one who brought up the holiday (or holy day) in the first place.

Christmas is the celebration of the Incarnation, the Word of God becoming human. I am grateful that it has infiltrated our culture like a secret agent waiting to draw people into the wonder of God's amazing grace. Every year I hope that this Christmas will be the time when people discover the wonderful gift of God in Jesus our Christ.

Our whole purpose as the Church is to share Christ with our neighbors and with the whole world. As we invite folks to worship with us this Christmas, we are sharing the real gift of Christmas with our world. So, I wish you a Merry Christmas. I wish the whole world a Merry Christmas.

Tanzanian Happenings



As of this writing Immanuel finished drilling well #13 which is located at the Kidugala Bible School. This Bible school is well respected throughout the Southern Diocese of Tanzania and beyond for providing quality education for evangelists and pastors. The evangelist program is a Swahili taught 3-year curriculum, and the pastoral program is an English taught 4-year program. For years this institution has struggled with a reliable source of quality water. On Immanuel's last trip in August that became even more evident. Thanks to the continued support of Immanuel's members and friends of Immanuel over the long haul and a couple of resent contributions to the well drilling projects, this well is becoming a reality. Even though the location evaluation and the actual drilling have been completed it will take some time for the pump installation, tower and infrastructure to be completed. Our friends in Kidugala especially at the school are excited and grateful that Immanuel is supporting them in providing quality water for the school, student housing and vocational training for the students.

NOVEMBER COUNCIL MEETING SUMMARY

The Immanuel Council met November 4 with 10 of 12 members present. John Taggs led devotions. December devotions will be led by Vicki Strissel.

Treasurer's Report: October income was \$24,117.99 and expenses were \$24,879.33 for a loss of \$761.34. YTD income is \$262,085.80 and expenses are \$229,566.86 for a net income of \$32,518.94 (which includes \$20, 053 in unspent refugee food aid.) General fund balance is \$130,671.93. Capital savings balance is \$84,762.14.

Worship/Evangelism: We have lined up Peggy Wolverton to be our guest organist for Palm Sunday 2026. In Advent we will introduce a time of silent preparation during a prelude. Pastor has proposed introducing a brief look at the catechism during worship each Sunday.

Fellowship/Education: Bonfire on October 25 had about 15 people participate. Thanks to Julie Vorm for heading up an Operation Christmas Child gift box collection. Pie Potluck will be held after the Thanksgiving Eve service on November 26. Christmas Caroling will be held after the December 21 service. There will be a game night on January 4 at 4 p.m.

Property: Recommendation is to dig up the sewer line for replacement. Will need to bring that to the Annual Congregational Meeting.

Old Business: Rachel Scott concert is scheduled for December 6th at 6:30pm in the Sanctuary. They accepted the financial terms of \$1000 plus free will offering. Insurance carrier will not cover liability for a non-member to conduct classes at our building.
