

IMMANUEL'S INSIGHTS FEBRUARY 2011

Recently the Crystal Cathedral, home of Possibility Preacher Robert Schuller, filed for Chapter Eleven bankruptcy. Until his retirement in 2006, Schuller was best known for his "Hour of Power" TV broadcast that began in 1970. At one time the "Hour of Power" broadcast was the world's most widely watched hour-long church service. One of Schuller's most popular books was "The Be Happy Attitudes: 8 Positive Attitudes That Can Transform Your Life", based on Jesus teachings from the Sermon on the Mount. At one time Robert Schuller was one of the most widely known preachers in America.

Consider Jesus the preacher. Quite often the crowds went away amazed, but also confused. Most of the time Jesus' own disciples did not understand his parables, forcing him to take them aside and explain it to them bit by bit. His conversion success rate was hit and miss; Nicodemus walked away born again, but the young rich ruler was not willing to "sell all he had and give to the poor and then come and follow Jesus." Eventually it was his preaching that got Jesus killed: the Pharisees and Teachers of the Law simply grew tired of being labeled hypocrites.

Once Jesus preached: "Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him up at the last day." And while we recognize the truth of these words through the Institution of the Lord's Supper and the proof of these words through Jesus own resurrection from the dead, many of the people of Jesus day simply felt he had gone too far. John writes: "On hearing it, many of his disciples said, "This is a hard teaching. Who can accept it?" Jesus went on to say, "This is why I told you that no one can come to me unless the Father has enabled him." John notes that the response was immediate: "From this time many of his disciples turned back and no longer followed him." (John 6, NIV)

Consider Jesus the preacher. There is not one "Be-Happy Attitude" among any of his beatitudes. His Sermon on the Mount is often considered so unrealistic in its ethical demands that Jesus must have been using hyperbole – deliberately exaggerating so that the people wouldn't take him literally. That is, setting the bar so high so that everyone would know that Jesus never really meant that we were to strive to reach it.

And while it may be true that we can't, we can't reach the ethical bar Jesus has set, it is also very true that Jesus did. He not only passed the bar he had set for himself, but surpassed it.

Jesus, hearing that many of his disciples had turned back and were no longer following him, turned to his inner circle, the chosen twelve. "What about you?" Jesus asked the Twelve. "You do not want to leave too, do you?" Simon Peter answered for all of them, "Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life. We believe and know that you are the Holy One of God."

And since that is true, since Jesus really is the Holy One of God, think of the possibilities! Possibilities that even Robert Schuller could never have imagined. Consider Jesus the preacher. Jesus never built a cathedral. Jesus never started a TV ministry. Jesus never even wrote a book. But two thousand years later, Jesus is still preaching. And his Words will remain forever.

TANZANIA UPDATE

Health The Health clinic serves Kidugala, 12 preaching points & several other villages. They are in need of an autoclave (sterilizer). At this time they clean instruments & other items by boiling water. They are still gathering cost & model information.

Education Immanuel is endeavoring on an Orphan Education Program. This would be an on-going support to enable orphans to attend school. With currently 300 orphans, the estimated cost is \$7500/year (an average of \$25.00 per student/per year). This project will be supported by sponsorships & fund-raisers. This year, proceeds from the Super Bowl Snack Sale & the Soup Supper Auction will be used to get this project started so that we can soon see these orphans receiving education opportunities.

<u>Agriculture</u> Currently, the maize has been planted & the Kidugala area is starting to now see some good rains. Beans have not been planted as yet, but soon will be. They are exploring various types of beans that may be better producers for the Kidugala area. Much Agriculture business is developing with more exciting news to be reported next month.

Development Philipo Mloge will be taking his national examinations in February. Philipo's wife, Atu gave birth to a little girl in November-they named her Gloria. She is welcomed home by brother Ezra & sister Dorice, keep their family in your prayers. Jason Mtokoma will also be taking examinations in medical school during February. Pastor Wallace Lupenza's father has been in the hospital & having surgery-keep his family in your prayers. Also, keep Pastor Nuru Kahwili in your prayers. The Kidugala District encompasses a lot of area & people, with Pastor Wallace away attending his father it puts a great deal on her alone.

Agenda approval was moved, seconded and approved. October Council Minutes approved.

TREASURER'S REPORT:

Full written copy available in the church office.

November summary: Offerings were good in November and expenses were in live or slightly lower than budgeted amounts. 2010 offerings were lower than 2009 but lower expenses more than offset the shortfall.

To His Glory: the only expense in November was debt reduction. In December THG paid \$25,000.00 for roof expenses. A large THG donation came in during December which helped limit the amount of roof repair/replacement money coming from the ILC line of credit. \$20,000.00 came from the line of credit with \$12,000.00 from the general budget for roof expenses.

With the approval of the congregation at the General Meeting on January 30, the To His Glory fund will become a general use Capital Fund after April 2010 (the official end of the campaign). Approx. \$50,000.00 will be needed annually to maintain the ILC buildings and grounds.

The 2011 budget was reviewed. A copy will be available in the office and with the materials for the annual meeting. Some categories are lower than 2010 and others are slightly higher. Overall the budget is about \$8300.00 higher than 2009. The budget will be presented at the annual meeting. The Treasurer's report was approved.

COUNCIL COMMITTEE HIGHLIGHTS:

Full written reports are available in the church office.

MISSION/OUTREACH: No written report. Money has been donated for a farming plot in Tanzania at an Agriculture College and toward the Women's Center. There will be a pancake feed on January 9 for Habitat for Humanity. The web site and a Facebook account are available.

WORSHIP: The Christmas worship schedule was reviewed.

EDUCATION: As written. The Children's' Christmas Program on 12/19 went well.

FELLOWSHIP: As written.

PROPERTY: The bell tower lights have been fixed thanks to Barney Ahrenholtz and Randy Tilk. Our custodian has done a great job this year. The ILCW has approached the property committee regarding remodeling the ILC kitchen. The ILCW will develop a preliminary design. It was suggested that a special spring and fall cleaning day be established for the kitchen. On the ILC roof, all the work now completed will be all that is done until spring 2011.

STEWARDSHIP: There will be council representatives for the stewardship in 2011. ILC members who use Thrivent should contact the company regarding having ILC designated for charitable funding. Reviewing the 2010 Stewardship Pledge drive, fewer members pledged less money than 2009 but the money keeps coming in to cover ILC expenses.

OLD BUSINESS: The nominating committee still needs to fill openings for Council Vice President, the Fellowship and Stewardship Committees. The Trust committee needs another member.

Regarding general safety issues around the ILC buildings, the ILC insurance provider has lots of materials that members/council members may find useful. The materials will be available in the church office.

NEW BUSINESS: It was proposed that ILC develop a new statement of faith to be posted on the ILC web site. The statement will have supporting scriptural references. The statement was reviewed and approved to put on the web site.

The annual meeting will be held January 30 at 10:30 right after worship service. The quorum will be approx. 48 people.

After the June Scott estate is settled, sometime early in 2011, a special committee will need to be formed to advise the ILC Church Council on how the donation will be distributed as per the specific rules of the ILC Constitution.
