Sally Simdorn. Elected to the 2020 Nominating Committee were Craig Olson, Ilene Mand Rick Chipman. Elected as delegates to Salem Lutheran Homes Association were Maggie Hatcher, Sandy Nelsen, Patti Kumm, Galen & Janet Johannsen and Judi Olson. Elected as delegates to LCMC were Cheryl Nielsen and Donna Nelson. Elected as Camp Ambassadors were Maggie Hatcher and Vickie Carstens.

Treasurer reported a 2019 end of year net income of \$452 which was our first surplusin several years. Thanks to all the generous givers at Immanuel. The 2020 budget of \$283,140 was approved unanimously.

A motion was made and passed to have the council appoint a constitutional review committee to review the constitution of Immanuel with a view toward making suggestions about possible updates.

IMMANUEL'S INSIGHTS

Dear Friends in Christ,

Jesus proclaimed that every individual life has value in the love of God. Luther argued for freedom of conscience for individuals. But our Christian faith was never meant to be an individualistic experience. Christianity is about building a community called the Church.

America is becoming more and more individualistic. Social isolation is a growing problem in our society. People don't know their neighbors and therefore they care little for their communities. People don't have friends they can rely on and therefore they feel alone.

Worship in American churches is becoming more and more individualistic. People sit in theatre style seats facing a stage with theatre lighting, loud musical performers, and engaging videos. Everything is designed to give people an individual experience that satisfies their tastes.

Historically Christian worship has been about creating community, reminding us that we are not alone, and connecting us with one another as the Body of Christ. We worship in a well-lit room so that we can see each other. We sit in pews where we can (theoretically) rub shoulders with others. We keep music at a volume that allows us to hear the congregation singing. Ideally we sing songs with simple rhythms and accessible pitch ranges for average singers. Ideally we also sing songs that are not about private experience (I, me, and my) but are about our shared experience in Christ (we, us, our).

We confess our sins together, recognizing that none of us are too bad to come to church and none of us are too good to come to church. It's like a "Sin Addicts Anonymous" meeting where we all introduce ourselves with "Hi, I'm Joe and I'm a sinner seeking grace". Some of us have had a good week and some of us have had a bad week, but we all need to be here to get back on -- or to stay on -- the wagon of grace.

We share the peace of Jesus with a smile and a touch. For some people this may be the only touch they experience all week. It is not a "hello" moment. It is a moment of "God loves you", "you are family", and "I'm glad you are here." We are doing the gospel for each other by proclaiming peace with God and with each other through the forgiveness of Jesus.

We confess our faith together out loud in the words of the Creed. It is good to hear our voices blending together as we proclaim the faith we share with millions of Christians of the past 20 centuries. We have a wide variety of opinions about politics and moral issues. But we have a shared faith that unites us in spite of our many differences.

Sermons are not so much a practical seminar in how to have a happy life as they are a reminder of the story that gives meaning to our existence. Sermons are the remembering and reclaiming of God's Word for us in Law and in Gospel so that we might be formed and reformed as the family of Jesus for the world. Living our daily lives in a "wilderness of cultural unbelief", we need to be pulled into the story that created and continues to create the community of faith. Worship that offers a religious product to individuals will not do much to counter the isolation and polarization of modern life. But worship that is not "all about me" but "more about us" will nurture the kind of community that will truly bring faith, hope, and love to our fractured world.



COUNCIL MEETING SUMMARY January 14, 2020—7 pm

The Immanuel Church Council met January 14 with 12 of 14 members present.

Vicki Carstens shared devotions from Luke 2:34-35 about looking into the future. Steve Allen will lead devotions in February.

Treasurer reported December income of \$35,082 and expenses of \$24,011. We ended 2019 with a small surplus of \$452.72 for the year. General Fund at the end of 2019 stood at \$26,624. Capital Savings Account stood at \$11,506.

Outreach: Community Kitchen went well in December. For 2019 we donated over 800 lbs. of food to the Food Pantry. Committee reached out to the only LCMC congregation in Australia which is about 40 kilometers from the fires so they have fire refugees in their community and the air quality is not good. They asked us to please pray for rain.

Fellowship: Planning for Talent show in January and a Fine Dining evening in February.

Executive: Ballot was presented to the council. Council approved to recommend to the congregation: John Taggs (president), Deb Brix (secretary), Derek Chapman (worship), Jonne Carlsen (fellowship), Mary Petersen (education), Cheryl Chipman (outreach), Wayne Nelson (property), Darin Haake and Sally Simdorn (Trust and Memorial). Nomination committee to be nominated from the floor.

Verne will recruit someone to audit the books for 2019.

Council approved to add forming a constitutional review committee to the annual meeting agenda.
