Hymn Festival

Please participate in our survey so that we can make sure that good Lutheran hymns are represented.

The Worship Committee is planning this hymn festival as a way to share the music of our renovated pipe organ with the community. Invitation posters have been sent to neighboring churches and can also be picked up at the church to share with friends.

Refreshments and fellowship will follow the hymn festival. We are looking for folks to share cookies and bars for the fellowship. A sign-up list is in the church office. Come join us on Sunday, February 23, at 2:00 to find out if your favorite hymns made the list of top hymns and to enjoy singing the songs that Christians love.

Camps

In western lowa we are blessed with 2 Lutheran Bible camps that align with our faith and mission: Riverside and Ingham/Okoboji. Immanuel encourages families to participate in the camping programs of Riverside and Ingham/Okoboji either by attending family camp together or by sending children and youth to camp. We know that a week at camp gives young people a deeper connection to their faith and to their church. We encourage you to check out the programs at Ingham and Okoboji at okoboji.org or at Riverside at riversidelbc.org.

We believe in camp so much that we have teamed up to provide \$300 scholarships for any child or family that attends Riverside or Ingham/Okoboji for a full week of camp. Flyers with a scholarship form are available at the church. In addition, registering before March 1 saves you another \$30.

Dear friends in Christ,

One of the blessings of the past year has been relationships that have developed between the community of Immanuel and the South Sudanese (or Mabaan) community in Harlan. This new friendship has been a blessing to both Immanuel folks and to the Mabaan community. For the past year a group of Immanuel members have been meeting quarterly with a group of Mabaan friends for fellowship. We have shared both American and Sudanese food. We have shared information and resources with one another. Tutoring in English and school subjects has begun. Immanuel's reputation as a friend of the Mabaan community has spread to Omaha, Des Moines, and even to Ethiopia.

This is a God thing. Just as God used a seminary friendship to invite Immanuel into a partnership with Kidugala, God has invited us into this partnership with the Mabaan community in Harlan. The Church is always stronger when it is open to the world around us. God wants the Church around the world to be united as one body in Christ.

One of the things we have noticed about our Mabaan friends in Harlan is that most of them are sending every extra dollar they earn back to support family and friends who are still in the refugee camps in Ethiopia. They can't waste anything on themselves when they know family and friends are depending on them for food. The refugees in the camps receive only a bare minimum of corn each month from the United Nations. The result is malnutrition and hunger.

We asked how we could help. Together we came up with the idea of making people aware of the food insecurity of the Mabaan refugees. A group of Immanuel folk and Mabaan folk worked to organize a new partnership between Immanuel and a Church in Asosa, Ethiopia, near the refugee camps. The Asosa church formed a committee of trusted leaders to organize a food distribution for the refugee camps. From our experience in Tanzania, we know that Africans know how to stretch a little into a lot. We sent them \$1450 and they organized a food distribution.

Now I would like to invite members of Immanuel to join me in making a monthly contribution toward food assistance in these refugee camps. We can't feed everybody. But if we can help some children avoid malnutrition, that will change the world. I would love to see Immanuel sending at least \$1000 per month to Asosa for food. If you can help, would you consider making a monthly donation marked "refugees."

I believe this calling comes from God. Once again, God has trusted us with this opportunity to change the world for some children in Africa.





JANUARY COUNCIL MEETING SUMMARY

The Immanuel Council met January 14 with 11 members present. John Taggs led devotion with a passage from Dietrich Bonhoeffer.

Treasurer: December income was \$42,277 and expenses were \$26,725. We ended 2024 with a positive net of \$5,804. General Fund is at \$98,754 and Capital Reserve is at \$79,486.

Worship/Evangelism: Immanuel will host a hymn festival for the community on

Sunday, February 23. Grant money has been applied for and received for advertising. The program will be based on a local survey of top hymns.

Stewardship/Outreach: January Mission Partner will be LCMC. 810 pounds of food were donated in 2024 to the Shelby County Food Pantry.

Property: Clean out of junk room is set for Saturday, February 1.

Executive: A financial review was conducted. WIC has asked to use our facility for their semi-monthly clinic. Council approved.

Old Business: Jared Walters shared his proposal for Immanuel to serve as his B.A. in Ministry internship site. Council approved.

2025 ILC ANNUAL CONGREGATIONAL MEETING

58 voting members attended the 2025 Annual Meeting of Immanuel on Sunday, January 19. Pastor Nielsen led devotions from Luke 5 about the new wineskins needed for the new wine of faith in Jesus.

The treasurer reported 2024 income of \$284,872 and expenses of \$279,067 for a net income of \$5,804. The congregation approved a 2025 budget of \$288,491.

Elected to Church Council were Kirk Jacobsen, Ken Nielsen, Scott Shannon, and Vickie Strissel. We thank Rich and Barb Furst for their service.

Elected to the Trust and Memorial Committee was Dave Voge. We thank Rich Daberkow for his service.

Elected to the Nominating Committee were Darin Haake, Lonnie Pitts, and Mitch Petersen.

Elected as delegates to the 2025 LCMC Gathering were Becky Chipman and Craig Olson. Elected as Salem Lutheran Homes delegates were Maggie Hatcher, Sandy Nelsen, Judi Olson, Jared and Katelyn Walters. Elected as our camp delegates were Hope Chipman and Maggie Hatcher.

John Taggs reported that Jared Walters has been approved to serve an internship at Immanuel for his B.A. in Ministry.

Pastor Nielsen reported on Immanuel's partnership with immigrants from South Sudan. Some members of Immanuel have proposed that we invite people to provide monthly support for nutrition assistance to refugee camps in Ethiopia.

Pastor Nielsen noted that 2025 marks 20 years of our partnership with Kidugala, Tanzania. We have invited Kidugala to send two ambassadors to Harlan to help us celebrate this milestone.

Pastor Nielsen noted that LCMC has a congregation in the Palisades community where wildfires have destroyed many homes. We can reach out to people there through that congregation.
