15th Annual Danish Dolls Aebelskiver/Frikadeller Dinner



Dear Friends in Christ,

How many members does your church have? Has anybody ever asked you that question? I get that question every once in a while. And I'm never quite sure how to answer. Officially, we reported 631 members in our annual report. But is that really a true answer?

What does it mean to be a member of a church? At least one church in our community says they don't have members. So, what do they have? If the people who attend

worship at their church are not members, what are they? Religious consumers? Clients? Just an audience?

Where did the idea of church membership come from? The word "member" originally referred to a part of a body. To be dismembered meant to lose an important part of one's body. The New Testament used the word "membership" to talk about how Christians relate to one another in the Church. We are connected to one another as functioning members of the Body of Christ.

These days many younger Americans resist the idea of committing to groups as members. All kinds of social organizations are seeing their memberships decline. Some would suggest that this is exactly why the Church should continue to push the idea of membership because Jesus calls us to make a commitment to one another as the Body of Christ. We are not just church consumers or church shoppers. We are members of the Body of Christ. And if we refuse to make a membership commitment to a particular congregation, we are saying to the body, I don't need you and you don't need me.

There are many non-denominational churches that have abandoned the idea of church membership. However, the consequences of abandoning formal membership are troubling. For one, it just feeds into the consumer mentality of many American church shoppers. They go to church only for what they can get out of it, without any thought of giving, sharing, or serving.

Secondly, it means that the leadership of a church is accountable to no one. The pastor and the board don't have members holding them accountable. Church leaders just live in their own echo chamber shaping the church to their liking without real input from a committed and diverse Body of Christ.

Perhaps churches are abandoning the idea of membership because they see how careless and superficial membership has become in many churches, just a formality with no real commitment or accountability. Unfortunately, any time a congregation gets over 400 members, it becomes difficult to keep track of everyone. Records get mixed up.

That is true at Immanuel. We find that some people who think they are members of Immanuel are not on our roster of members. We also have heard from some people listed on our membership roster that they have never been a member at Immanuel. The membership list has become a list of names without real meaning. It is any wonder that some churches have given up on keeping membership lists?

Then we have "The Great Resignation" to factor in. That is what people have called the past few years as many Baby Boomers have retired early and others have quit their jobs looking for new callings and new directions. It seems that the Great Resignation has also hit many congregations including ours. Our church, like many others, was closed for two months in 2020 and a good number of members have never returned. Some have joined other churches and never told us. Others just got into the habit of staying home. Others have decided they don't need the Church.

So how many members does Immanuel really have? In reality, it doesn't matter whether we have 300 or 600 or 900. The number doesn't really change how we operate. We do weddings and funerals for anyone who is looking for Lutheran ministry. We welcome anyone to participate in our worship and life together whether they are members or not. Still, I would like to be able to give a curious outsider or a prospective member a more accurate answer. I hope to have some good conversations about this in 2024.

<u>Over 200,000</u> redeemable cans and bottles were donated, counted, and delivered in 2023! This gives Immanuel's Tanzania Committee **\$10,000** to support orphans, develop agriculture, complete well projects, distribute Bibles, award high school scholarships, etc., in the Kidugala area.

We continue to encourage everyone to collect redeemable cans and bottles and drop them off in the cage at the back of the church. What is deposited there is collected, counted, and then delivered to the Atlantic Redemption Center. This past year nine trip were made to the redemption center. The most in one load was 24,595 pieces, and the smallest load was 20,655 pieces.

The success of this project would not be possible without you, as well as the generosity of the surrounding community. Thank you!

DECEMBER COUNCIL MEETING SUMMARY

The Immanuel Church Council met December 11 of 13 members and one guest present.

Joey Hansen led devotions reflecting on miracles he experienced in the past few months. He read from John 9. January devotions will be led by Craig Olson.

Treasurer: November income was \$18,207 and expenses were \$20,198. General Fund balance on December 1 was \$78,323. Capital Savings Account is at \$66,080. Organ Fund is at \$28,517. TZ Account is at \$31,951.

Worship/Evangelism: The organ is completed. All that remains is the programming for the computer interface which should be completed by December 24. Pipe organ dedication is set for February 11. Discussed a special arrangement for our celebration of Maundy Thursday in March. We have some young people who have agreed to sit on the committee this coming year.

Fellowship/Education: Immanuel's Got Talent is scheduled for January or February.

Outreach/Stewardship: Our January Mission Partner is LCMC. Food pantry donations are at 1037 pounds. Volunteer thank-you cards were distributed, written, and delivered in November. Tanzania Well #10 is flowing. Pies were made and sold. Still rhubarb remaining. Doc Strissel's seed corn is on the way to Tanzania. All is well in the Sharing Cupboard.

Property: Outdoor decorations were put up thanks to Vance Arnold, Greg, and Ken. Fire alarm system was inspected. Mower is being serviced for next year.

Executive: Recommended proposed 2024 budget of \$303,450 (5 % increase). Motion carried. Still pursuing candidates for next year's election. Pastor has phone interviews scheduled with 3 applicants for the office administrator position.

Pastor's Report: Recommended Matt and Mary Hoch and Hazel for membership at Immanuel. Pastor will introduce thoughts about membership renewal at annual meeting, but no action will be taken until 2025.


ILCW DIRECTORY: Jan Applegate is updating. A new Mission Statement was voted on by the Board and included.
