FROM THE *Pastor's Desk*

Dear Friends in Christ,

What a gift it is to have a community of faith with whom to celebrate the wonder and beauty of Christmas, the gift of Jesus! Christmas in the Church always feels kind of like a homecoming when we see family and friends that are home for Christmas. And there is a great joy being in a room full of people singing songs that we all know and love. It was a great pleasure to have a choir of over 20 members singing the message of Christmas on December 14.

And it is always wonderful to have a group of children to share in the joy of Christmas. We had a good group of children sharing the message of Christmas on the last Sunday in Advent. I really enjoy seeing how many children have become involved in our ministry with youth and children.

In a medium-sized congregation like Immanuel, the number of children will tend to increase and decrease from year to year. When I came to Immanuel 11 years ago, we had a good number of children involved in worship and Sunday School. Then we kind of went through a valley with very few children participating. Now our numbers are stronger again. We had over 20 children involved with our Christmas program not including the younger ones who joined in on "Away in a Manger." I have a feeling we will seek peaks and valleys in the years ahead.

I am so very grateful to the adults who have been serving as leaders in our ministry with youth and children. However, as I look to the future, I think I see some changes that are needed. The way we are doing ministry now is not very sustainable. We are relying on a few adults who will not be able to sustain their current involvement indefinitely. I am thinking especially about our JAM ministry with preschoolers and first and second graders and our LYO ministry with high schoolers. We are not likely to find people willing to step in and carry the load in the same way that our current leaders have served.

Our ministry would be much more sustainable if we had teams of people willing to serve instead of just a few individuals carrying the load. That is the way youth ministry was done when I was in high school. We had several couples who served together for just a few years at a time with a new couple rotating in every year or so.

As I think about the future of JAM ministry with our little ones and LYO ministry with our older youth, I envision 3 or 4 couples with each group working together, taking turns, and showing our young people the breadth of our congregation's commitment to them. It does take a congregation (faith village) to share faith with our young people.

In 2026, I hope that we will begin to find members who are willing to join with others to take our ministry with children and youth to the next level and make it sustainable for the future. Do you know someone who would consider becoming more involved with our ministry with children and youth?

The Immanuel Council met December 9 with 10 of 12 members present. Eric read Vicki's devotions on Advent as preparation for Jesus. Joey will lead devotions in January.

John Taggs, Amy Kaster, Eric Chipman, Scott Shannon, Joey Hansen, Kirk Jacobsen, Dave Greve, and Craig Olson volunteered for deacon duties.

Treasurer's Report: November income was \$21,759 and expenses were \$23,287 for a loss of \$1,528. YTD income is \$283,845 and expenses are \$252,854 for a net income of \$30,990. General fund balance is \$129,267. Capital savings balance is \$85,262. Motion carried to move \$30,000 from the general fund into a CD for up to a year.

Worship/Evangelism: Peggy Wolverton to be our guest organist for Palm Sunday 2026 with an organ recital following the service. In Advent we have implemented a prelude time for prayerful preparation for worship. Discussed 2-hour late start for snowy Sunday mornings. We are looking for input on how people would like to be alerted to late starts and cancellations.

We will seek additional bids on the TV monitor for the new child care area. Mary Taggs is working on the design and implementation for the childcare area in the narthex.

Fellowship/Education: Thanks to Julie Vorm for heading up Operation Christmas Child. We doubled our boxes this year. LYO had a lock-in overnight in the church with 14 youth. Pie Potluck was held after the Thanksgiving Eve service on November 26. Thanks to Donna and Greg Nelson for putting up the tree and thanks to the rest of the decorators. Christmas caroling will be Sunday, December 21. There will be a game night on January 4 at 4 p.m.

Outreach/Stewardship: December Mission Partner is Lutheran Church of South Sudan.

Property: Property Committee really liked the 2-hour late start. Chad's Lawn Care is doing our parking lot snow removal. Thanks to Vance Arnold for providing the lift and Michael Monson for helping us replace ceiling tiles in the sanctuary. Elevate Roofing found 3 tiny holes in the roof and patched them on December 8. Clay Amadoo has given us new bids for his service. We will put him on hold. We may consider moving to vinyl flooring as an update.

Executive: Council agreed to honor the contract provision for severance pay for our former office administrator. Council set the date for the 2026 Annual Congregational Meeting for Sunday, January 25, at 10:30 A.M. in the fellowship hall. Annual reports are due to the church office on Monday, January 12. Nominating Committee prepared a ballot of Dave Greve, Joey Hansen, Craig Olson, and Alex Monson for church council and Gary Jahn for Trust and Memorial. Trust and Memorial Committee approved External Mission Grants of \$2500 for both West Central Community Action and for the ILC Refugee Fund. They also approved \$2000 scholarships for Jared Walters at Institute of Lutheran Theology and for a scholarship program for evangelists in Kidugala, Tanzania.

New Business: Council worked on the 2026 ILC Budget. Approved a Budget recommendation for the Annual Congregational Meeting.
