Thursday (July 27) we will have a 5:00 p.m. **program** for families and friends followed by a hot dog feast.



Dear Friends in Christ,

What is your church like? Anybody ever ask you that question? How does one begin to answer that question? We could say that we are Lutheran, but most people outside of a Lutheran Church don't know what Lutheran means. So how would you best describe Immanuel to someone who is not Lutheran? What 3 words would you use to describe Immanuel? I would describe Immanuel as traditional, sacramental, and evangelical.

We are traditional. We consider ourselves to be a movement within the one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We are open to new songs and new ways of doing things, but we treasure the traditions and wisdom of the generations of Christians that have come before us. We follow a traditional liturgical pattern of worship that puts the focus on God and God's Word rather than on styles of music, personalities of pastors, or trends in popular culture.


We are sacramental. Baptism and Communion are very important to us. They are not rituals that we do to earn merit or promises that we make to God. They are God's promises to us and a means of God's grace working faith into us. Our worship is not about performing for God or about being entertained. Our worship is about seeking, celebrating, and sharing God's gifts of grace and truth given to us in his Word and Sacraments. We gather in worship because we believe God's Word is good for us.

We are evangelical. The word evangel is a New Testament word meaning "good news." We are shaped by the 16th century Reformation movement which was sparked by the rediscovery of the Gospel good news of salvation by grace alone through faith alone in Christ alone. We are a Gospel-focused Church. We read the Bible because it gives us Jesus and we believe Jesus speaks to us through the Bible. So we distinguish between Law and Gospel in the Bible. The Law kills our spiritual pride. The Gospel give us life and frees us to love God and others. The Bible is misused when it is preached as just another self-help book.

Those are the 3 words I would use to describe Immanuel: traditional, sacramental, and evangelical. I wonder what 3 words you would describe to describe Immanuel. I wonder what 3 words our neighbors would use to describe their churches.

JUNE COUNCIL MEETING SUMMARY

The Immanuel Church Council met June 13 with 10 of 13 members present. John Taggs led devotions. Craig Olson will lead devotions in July.

Treasurer: May income was \$49,143 including \$27,459 for the organ project. May expenses were \$47,700 including \$24,000 paid out to the organ builder. General Fund balance was \$76,645. Building Fund balance was \$59,955. After paying first installment, the Organ Project balance was \$48,364.

Worship/Evangelism: To enhance the organ, a tile company recommended that we paint the ceiling tiles in the balcony to provide more resonance. We discontinued our tuning contract with Darrow Pipe Organ. Increased our pulpit supply compensation from \$200 per weekend to \$250 per weekend to match area rates.

Fellowship/Education: Easter breakfast was well supported. Over 20 people joined the bowling fellowship in April. 30 people from 6 families attended our Graduate Breakfast in May. 10 children and 2 families are attending one of our church camps with scholarships from the congregation. Bible School Day Camp plans include a Wednesday night S'more Church at Prairie Rose for the whole congregation and a Thursday evening VBS program and picnic dinner. Rally Sunday will include a video/slide program on our educational ministry that Becky Chipman has put together followed by a tailgate lunch and games.


Outreach/Stewardship: 514 pounds donated to the food pantry. Sharing cupboard and fridge have been sparser than expected. July Mission Partner is West Central Community Action. Tanzania Team is planning on 3 going to Kidugala in August. A group from Immanuel attended the presentation in Shelby by Pastor Haamer of the Estonian Lutheran Church.

Property: The sewer line has been augured out. Wasp traps have been set up, but no wasps spotted lately.

Executive: Council had a good discussion about membership renewal process. We are seeking ways to invite people to consider their commitment to Christ through the Church. We are also seeking ways to be more welcoming to new members and to streamline volunteer co-ordination. Decided to continue to develop the process and to present at the annual congregational meeting in January. Also, looking to revise a visitor/new member welcome resource.

The second day each set of families do not see each other until the ceremony. There are no rings exchanged but a gift of a necklace for the bride instead. And the groom's family buys a jewelry gift for the bride also. There are no attendants for the bride and groom. There is much dancing. food and celebrating but



no alcoholic drinks. Each guest attending gets a gift which Doris showed-a silver keepsake small urn-like container w/lid. Doris was attired by the family in traditional dress of sarong etc. and handmade leather shoes. She showed the fabric that made up her wedding attire— probably 6 yards in length—wrapped around her many times and fastened over the shoulder.
