Dear Friends in Christ,

I will be making a trip to Africa this month with Rick Chipman and Patty Allen. Our trip has two purposes. First, we are going to a refugee camp in Western Ethiopia where many refugees from South Sudan live. Our South Sudanese friends in Harlan have family and friends in that camp. They all send money back to the camp to provide food and other necessities for refugees. Several members of Immanuel have committed to sending a monthly gift to

provide food supplements for the refugees there.

Feeding hungry children is central to the mission of the church. Our mission is to tell the world of the love of God given to us in Jesus. But we can't tell people about the love of God without first showing people the love of God at work through us. Jesus fed crowds of hungry people and he has provided his Church with the resources to do the same. We live in a hungry world, and as our government is cutting back on feeding the hungry, now is the time for the Church to take up its calling to feed the hungry.

We have asked the local churches around the Sherkole refugee camp to organize a committee to use our gifts to purchase and share food. During our brief time in Ethiopia, we plan to meet with the committee, tour the camp, and discuss how best to use the funds that we will be providing each month.

Over \$6000 has been donated through the first 6 months of 2025 for this program. I am very grateful to everyone who has contributed either in an annual gift or in monthly gifts. It would be helpful if we could know how much Immanuel members plan to give so that we can budget a consistent amount each month.

This month we will start a list in the church office to keep track of how much members plan to contribute. I would ask everyone who has contribute or who plans to contribute to call the church office and let us know how much you plan to give for the year 2025.

Then we can divide that amount by 12 each month and provide a regular donation.

We will spend a little over a day at the refugee camp and then we will travel on to Tanzania to celebrate our 20-year partnership with the Lutheran Church in Kidugala. I was there in 2015 and enjoyed getting to know our mission partners there. This year will be an opportunity to affirm our friendship and the mission we share. Then the hope is that we will be bringing back with us 3 ambassadors from Kidugala for our celebration of our 20-year friendship and partnership.

Our 20-year relationship with Kidugala and our new opportunities in the Sherkole refugee camp are gifts of the Holy Spirit who calls God's people into the mission of sharing the grace of God with the world.

JUNE COUNCIL MEETING SUMMARY

The Immanuel Council met June 10 with 10 of 12 members present. Vicki Strissel led devotions from one her favorite books, The One Truth, which is a series of action plans to bridge the gap between knowing and doing. Joey Hansen will lead devotions in July. Dave Greve, John Taggs, Todd Madsen, Joey Hansen, Eric Chipman, Vicki Strissel, Kirk Jacobsen, and Craig Olson volunteered for deacon duties in July and August.

Treasurer's Report: May income was \$18,640 and expenses were \$19,188 leaving a loss of \$548. May YTD income was \$124,330 and expenses were \$126,692 leaving us at a negative of \$2,361. General Fund balance is \$70,222 plus \$25,000 totaling \$95,222 and the Capital Savings balance is at \$82,075.

Fellowship/Education – JAM, GROW, and LYO all saw growth in numbers this past year. Next year GROW will include 6th graders again as their numbers are too small for the confirmation program. VBS had 54 children in attendance with good support from adult and youth volunteers. We have had 18 children/youth signed up to go to camp this summer.

Property: Ken Nielsen took down the partition in the new library and did some electrical work. Carpet will be ordered.

Executive: We are still short of keys for the outside doors. These keys cannot be duplicated. We will need to create a sign-out system for keys and for the Hy-Vee charge card. **Pastor:** Recommended Lusiya Lena, Sani Mora, and Issa Nege for membership. They come from South Sudan and Ethiopian churches. Council approved. Thanks to Kayla Jacobs for leading worship on June 21. Will be away July 11-13. A video sermon is planned for that weekend. Will be in Africa July 21 to August 2. Shari Munyon will lead worship for July 27. There will be no Saturday evening worship on July 26 and August 2.

Old Business: Council accepted the Goede bid of \$22,120 for the HVAC systems for 4 rooms on the main floor of the education wing. Council approved donation of LED lights for the chapel. Seeking 2 bids for stripping and waxing fellowship hall floor.

New Business: Council offered the position of office administrator to Diane Greve.

Sharon introduced Linda Hopp's "Tanzania Facts, Fabrics and Fun Retreat" program with eighteen attending in the chapel. Lots of beautiful hand created Tanzania fabric/projects were displayed. Fact: In 1963 Tanzania became an Evangelical Lutheran Church of Tanzania (ELCT). Our connection w/Kidugala was through Pastor Heather while in seminary and in 2005 Cheryl Chipman traveled to Tanzania to meet these people. Carol Joy Holling of Ashland NE had traveled there as well. Young girls had no income so Carol was inspired to create a way to help the girls of Tanzania earn income to continue their education. Fabric hand created there was purchased, brought back to America and made into kits. A Fun Retreat began by taking reservations where the fabric kits could be purchased, then spending 3 days enjoying the time creating. Tanzanian Treasurers Fabric is a mission project of St. Matthew Lutheran Church in Omaha with 50% of the purchase price going to the Tanzanian Scholarship Fund and 50% to Tanzanian Artisans. In 2024 there were 9 recipients from Mt Kilimaniaro area. Five women studying at Women's Training Center with two studying cooking/catering, 2 in tailoring/fabric dying and 1 in hotel management. Two are in a 2 yr live in Montessori Teacher Training program and 2 are at Machame Nursing 3 yr live in program. Anyone can purchase fabric just by going to the conference center during a retreat. Next retreat is Feb 8-9-10, 2026. Excellent program-thank you! At program end we enjoyed delicious treats by Kathy in the Fellowship Hall. Sandy thanked all who helped with VBS in any way. We closed with the Lord's Prayer.
