

Dear Friends in Christ,

I saw a news report about churches that are struggling to stay financially viable during the pandemic because of reduced offerings. The report suggested that many churches may end up going out of business because of the pandemic and the resulting economic depression. At Immanuel we have not seen any reason for concern for the financial future of the congregation. Nor have any of the pastors that I have talked to. Members have continued to support their local congregations.



When Congress passed the 2 trillion dollar CARES Act, it included the Payroll Protection Program to help small businesses keep up their payroll for a couple of months during the shutdown. Some Senators made sure that churches were included in the program. And many urged churches to take advantage of the program. I know at least one church that has done so.

However, I am not very keen on the idea of taxpayer money going to support religious institutions. This means that our tax dollars are supporting Muslim, Mormon, and who knows what kind of religious organizations. This is money that should have been available to help small businesses stay alive. And it is money that will have to be paid for at some point, and churches don't pay taxes...yet. If churches close, it won't be because of the pandemic or the government. It will be because their members didn't support them.

Why do we support churches? It is because we believe in their purpose. And what is the purpose of a Church? Why does Immanuel Lutheran Church exist? We have a committee that has been reviewing our church constitution to recommend updates and improvements. One of the things we are suggesting is a clearer and more concise constitutional statement of purpose based on wording from the Great Commission and Luther's Small Catechism. Here is our proposal:

The mission of Immanuel is to follow Jesus Christ, making disciples (Christ-followers) by:

a. Calling people to worship God in Word and Sacrament with worship services that proclaim the gospel of justification by grace through faith in Christ alone and that invite people to respond in prayer, praise, thanksgiving, service, and witness.

b. Gathering people as members of the Body of Christ who care for one another as family.

c. Enlightening people with education in the Word of God applied to ministry in daily life.

d. Sanctifying (setting apart) and sending people and gifts to serve the world with the compassion of Christ by equipping people to serve in daily life, by reaching out to the poor and powerless, and by supporting local, regional, and global mission partners.

That is a purpose worth supporting and building upon. Thanks for your part in keeping Immanuel working toward this purpose.

COUNCIL MEETING SUMMARY May 12, 2020-7 pm

The Immanuel Church Council met May 12 with 11 of 14 members present by video conferencing. Pastor Phil led devotions from Psalm 62 in "The Songs of Jesus" by Tim Keller. June devotions will be led by Becky Chipman.

Treasurer reported April of \$26,608 and April expenses of \$14,691. Year to date income is \$101,813 (which is about \$1000 ahead of 2019). Year to date expenses are \$87,955 (which is about \$10,000 less than 2019). Our general fund account ended April at \$40,000. Our emergency fund savings are at \$17,653. Thanks to all who have continued to support the ministry of Immanuel.

Outreach – Immanuel has given 515 pounds to the Shelby County Food Pantry which is ahead of 2019.

Worship – Pastor met with Midwest Sound and lighting to get a second bid. Still awaiting that bid. He has also investigated some other possibilities being used in other churches which are quite a bit cheaper. We have a number of members making masks for folks when we begin gathering for worship.

Education – Considered the Christian Spanish Immersion Preschool program and decided to recommend that Immanuel not take that project on this year. Working on a recognition of our high school graduates.

Fellowship – Pastor Phil will be starting a Wednesday evening fellowship/Bible study time on Zoom.

Property – Have taken pictures of a rust problem in the mortar of our tuckpointing job. Thanks to Charlie Conrad for mowing our grass.

Executive Committee – Pastor is working on online and smart phone donation systems with Vanco who already handles our EFT giving.

Pastor's Report - Pastor took 9 days of vacation in April.

Hi Friends over there in ILC,

Greetings in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ. Here in Kidugala is fine the rain season now is over. We are waiting the harvest season to come hopefully in June to July respectively. We hope that you are doing fine too as we do here in Kidugala.

It has been a long time since we communicated with you in giving you a report about some of our HEAD projects, we are sorry for that. Somehow it has been affected by the leadership changes in our Parish but everything is doing fine.

We thank God that this year we have been receiving a lot of rains than we expected normally for our crops and all the creation too. We believe this is also a blessing to us because we expect to have some good harvest from our shambas this year.

It is our hope and prayer that our Partnership will continue well and stronger this year too. Even though there is a world calamity of Covid19, we believe in Jesus name it will come to an end. In Tanzania all the Schools and universities are being closed but the Sunday services are still allowed. We use time of our church services to pray God for this world calamity. However, from this week all Sunday schools and confirmation classes are being stopped too. The Corona is a rough virus, but God will help us.

As we had already informed you, we again repeat that on 21st January 2020 we received another pastor for Kidugala Parish whose name is Frank Mexon Mng'ong'o. Frank replaced Pastor Enelika Chungu.

But also, we have chosen another Parish treasurer whose name is Evangelist Chesamu Mgaya who was an Evangelist at Masilu preaching point has replace Evangelist Rehema Kidzumbe whom the Diocese appointed her to be a treasurer for Kidugala District. Rehema now is working with pastor Yohana in the District. It's our expectations that we will well collaborate with these new leaders in our Partnership.
