CORNER Dear Friends in Christ,

In Acts 17 we read that while Paul was waiting in Athens, "he was greatly distressed to see that the city was full of idols." A contemporary translation might read that Paul was "triggered" to see that the city was full of idols. Before becoming the apostle of Christ to the Gentiles, Paul had been a Pharisee. And if there was one thing that Pharisees hated, it was the worship of idols. As a Pharisee, Paul would have been so triggered by those idols that he would have screamed at the people of Athens and called them idiots for worshiping blocks of stone or metal. He would have mocked them just like some of the Old Testament prophets did.

But instead, Paul approached those idolatrous pagan gentiles with humility and gentleness. He said, "People of Athens, I see that in every way you are very religious." He recognized that without the truth of God, those ancient pagans were lost in their search for meaning in life. Paul didn't not condemn them for being lost. He had sympathy for them.

Maybe it was because Paul remembered how lost he was before Jesus graciously confronted him on the road to Damascus. Paul was so lost that he thought God wanted him to arrest and beat up and even kill followers of Jesus. But then a lightning bolt from heaven knocked him down and he heard the voice of Jesus calling him into a whole new life. Paul knew that he could have been just as idolatrous as those Gentiles except for the grace of God.

It was also because Paul remembered that our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against forces of wickedness in the spiritual realm. Every human being is someone that Jesus came to rescue and call to himself. Therefore, as followers of Jesus, we should always speak out of love. Jesus called us to love our enemies because he loves our enemies just as much as he loves us. And he loves us a lot.

There are so many hateful angry voices in our society today criticizing people for their politics or their religion or their lack of religion. As followers of Jesus, we should not be among them. We may be triggered by certain political ideologies or by certain religious opinions, but we should remember two things. First, the only reason we are not lost in confusion and sin is because of the grace of God. And two, if we are to help people find the truth and grace of Jesus, we must do it with humility, gentleness, and patience. Anger and hatred will only drive people further away from the truth. We cannot hate anyone into faith.

If there is any hope for the future of our culture and our country, it will be because people turn off the angry voices of hate and turn toward the grace and truth of Jesus. If people hear Christians as just one more angry voice in the media, we have failed to follow Jesus. There is no excuse for anyone being an angry Christian. Angry people are really just people who have been hurt, or who have been frustrated, or who are afraid. They need to know Jesus.

Immanuel has partnered in the past with The Church of the Damascus Road (CODR) prison ministries to reach out to inmates at the Iowa correctional facilities in Rockwell City and Fort Dodge. Did you know that unemployment rates may be as high as 70 % among ex-offenders and as many as 50 % of released prisoners end up homeless and living on the streets? MAY COUNCIL MEETING SUMMARY

The Immanuel Church Council met May 9 with 10 of 13 members present. Steve Allen led devotions reflecting on Isaiah 43:1 from The Chosen daily devotional. John Tagg will lead devotions in June.

Treasurer: April income was \$31,289 and expenses were \$21,375. General Fund balance was \$76,297. Building Fund balance was \$58,955. Organ Project Balance was \$44,905 at the end of April.

Worship/Evangelism: Pulled pork supper fundraiser had over 130 in attendance and raised \$12,000 for the organ project. With a promised gift of \$11,000, we agreed to go forward on a contract with Temple organ to rebuild the pipe organ. The cost is now estimated to be \$72,000. We have had a little interest in the music director position.

Outreach/Stewardship: 452 pounds donated to the food pantry. Sharing cupboard and fridge are up and running. June Mission Partners are our 2 church camps (Riverside and Ingham/ Okoboji). Tanzania Team is looking for volunteers to join the mission trip in August. Scholarships are available.

Property: Ken Carstens is mowing the church lawn. We will look into cleaning out the sewer line. Still working on getting wasp traps set up in the church.

Executive: Pastor presented a letter regarding membership renewal as a way to encourage members to think about becoming more active. There will be one more photo Sunday on June 11. Members can still submit photos to the church office.

Suggestion was made that we remove the overgrown yew bushes by the entrance and replace them with something low maintenance but a little more contemporary. Suggestions are welcomed.

LYO is led by Eric Chipman and Pastor Phil. Each teacher in the video told of how long they've been teaching, activities done at each session including crafts, singing, games and snacking. LYO have supper together provided by the church. They all expressed how much they enjoy being with the youth of our congregation. GROW kids are each given an Adventure Bible which they learn to use and encouraged to highlight and make notes in it. At the end of their time in GROW they will be presented the Bible they have been using thru their 3 years. When starting Confirmation each student is given a new Bible. What an outstanding program. Many of us learned things we did not know about the educational program at ILC. Becky ended the program with prayer and all recited The Lord's Prayer. Thank You Becky and Pastor Phil and the other teachers for your unending commitment to make a difference for the youth attending.

FREE: Check out the books and DVDs on the table in the library. Take some home for your reading/watching summer enjoyment. Then pass them on for someone else to enjoy.




SUMMER BIBLE STUDY
