### **LENT IS HERE**

Lutherans love Lent. Perhaps it's because so many Lutherans live in the Upper Midwest and Lent means that winter is coming to an end. Perhaps it's because we Lutherans love to focus on the cross of Jesus. Perhaps it's because we love the build up to Easter. The imposition of ashes on Ash Wednesday has become especially popular among Lutherans. It creates a profound moment to stop and reflect on the shortness and fragility of our lives.



This year we are reviving our tradition of a simple meal before our Wednesday evening Lenten services. There will be no meal on Ash Wednesday which is a traditional day of fasting. Our Ash Wednesday worship will begin at 6:30. We will be finished by 7:30. That is important to families with young children.

Then on the next 5 Wednesdays of Lent there will be a simple meal served from 6:00 to 6:45. The Tanzania Team will host a pancake supper on March 9. On the other 4 Wednesdays, we are asking members of Immanuel to sign up to bring a gallon of soup of any kind. We hope to have a variety of tasty soups to enjoy.

Then we will gather at 7:00 for a brief (45-minute) worship service. The theme of our Midweek services is "Justice".

### Dear Friends in Christ,

There is a lot of debate in our society about what justice and is and how we work toward justice. Justice is essential to our world and yet justice has become controversial. God's Word has a lot to say about justice. From Genesis to Revelation, God is revealed as a God of justice and God calls his people to do justice, love mercy, and walk humbly with Him (Micah 6:8). So how do we do justice? This Lent, I would like to invite you to join me in thinking about doing justice in our complex and conflicted world.

There are different kinds of justice, but justice itself is simple. Justice is giving the proper value to people and giving them what they deserve whether good or bad. The complication comes in when we have competing ideas about life, marriage, race, poverty, and creation. But God has spoken very clearly to us about justice in each of these spheres.

Because God has spoken through the prophets and through Jesus, the Church is called to speak out for justice in our world. It may not be popular. It may be controversial. But to ignore God's call to justice is to support injustice. We are not going to solve every problem in our world, but we can bring some clarity and courage to do justice in our conflicted and unjust world.

Ash Wednesday will look at what justice is and how God does justice by justifying sinners. Then we will consider justice and the various conflicts in our world. How do we respond to questions about bioethics, abortion, and assisted suicide? How do we respond to questions about race and prejudice? How do we respond to questions about poverty and resource inequality? How do we respond to questions about the environment and climate change? Each of these topics are politically charged. But the question is not about what we think. The question is about what God has said.

Can we find common ground on these controversial issues? Or are we hopelessly polarized? I believe that as Christians we can find common ground in what God has said about justice. Because politics and legislation are blunt instruments, we may not always agree on how to act politically. There is room for differences of opinion about how to most effectively legislate justice in our complicated world. But if we find our common ground in Christ, we can work together even when we have differences of political opinions.

# FEBRUARY COUNCIL MEETING SUMMARY

The Immanuel Church Council met February 8 with 11 of 12 members present. John Taggs shared devotions from C.S. Lewis. Faith is not an escape from suffering but brings peace in suffering. Steve Allen will have devotions in March.

John Taggs, Derek Chapman, Ivy Nielsen, Steve Allen, Scott Shannon, Peg Haas volunteered for schedule of council persons on duty.

**Treasurer**: January income was \$24,250 and expenses were \$19,710. There is \$79,377 in the General Fund (including \$25,994 Ted Williams bequest) and \$53,986 in Capital Savings. **Outreach/Stewardship**: Food Pantry donations at 140 pounds. TZ Soup Supper/Auction set for March 26. The TZ committee is working with 2 private donors to drill 2 more water wells in the Kidugala area.

**Property**: Two new benches have been donated and placed at the fire pit in memory of Marian Riessen by her family. Still having issues with the programmable thermostats.

**Executive**: Pastor has worked on reconciling our membership database with our current membership number. It seems our membership numbers are still off. There are people who think they are members but are not in our database. And there are people who think they are no longer members but are still listed as members in our database. We don't really remove anybody unless they ask to be removed. Pastor presented the idea of a renewal or refreshing of our membership roster, inviting members to update their membership information and to indicate if they prefer to serve as active members or just participate as associate members. Council tabled the discussion to put together a proposal.

**Pastor:** Council approved Linda Norgaard for membership. Council approved Jared Walters preaching again for Pastor. Council approved pastor's mileage to represent LCMC at the invitation of area congregations. Pastor is working on a Mime drama of the Passion for Good Friday.

**SECRETARY'S REPORT:** The January minutes were reviewed. Sharon moved to accept the minutes as presented and Kathy seconded. Ayes all.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Checks were written for our 2021 Distributions totaling \$4000: West Central (meat certificates check to Fareway of \$1500), Salem Home (activities) \$500, Riverside Bible Camp \$500, Ingham Okoboji Bible Camp \$500, Foster Care Program \$500 and Feed My Starving Children program \$500. The Thank Offering total monies of \$945 check was written to Kris Olson-Harmon for the Kids at Risk program. A griddle was purchased at Target for \$53.49 to add to the kitchen. Donations of \$350 were received from the Della Holdsworth and Lowell Howe families and an individual donation of \$20 also received. Ending January balance is \$1571.98.

The Mission Quilters continue to receive good community help by sewing blocks together and binding quilts which is very much appreciated.
