LENT and HOLY WEEK 2024

At the center of our Christian faith is the death and resurrection of Jesus. The cross is where human sin and God's stubborn love collide. Easter is where we see the ultimate victor of that collision. In the weeks of March, we will read through the Gospel of John leading up to that fateful collision.

Then on Palm Sunday/Passion Sunday we will celebrate Jesus' triumphal entry to Jerusalem and remember the bitterness of the cross. On Maundy Thursday we will remember Jesus' last will and testament given to his followers the night before his death. On Good Friday we will meditate on the cross from the perspective of John's gospel. And finally, Easter morning we will celebrate the hope of the Gospel in the resurrection of Jesus.

Pastor had talked about having home groups on Maundy Thursday, but that will not happen this year. Instead we will gather together at the church on Maundy Thursday.

Each Wednesday evening, we will gather for worship after a soup supper. There is a sign-up list at the church to bring soup and to serve at the suppers. On Easter morning there will be a breakfast served at 8:00 a.m. We are looking for volunteers to bring breakfast casseroles and also to serve at the breakfast. A sign-up list will be available in the church office.

Dear friends in Christ,

We live in challenging times. Although the number of atheists seems to be growing, still by far the majority believe in God. I suspect one reason there are more atheists today is because so many people are cut off from the witness of creation. They spend too much time indoors, in manmade environments, and in front of electronic screens. They don't get out and smell the roses or ponder the starry sky.

Creation does do a better job than the Church of communicating God's power and divine majesty. Romans 1:20 says, "Ever since the creation of the world, God's eternal power and divine nature, invisible though they are, have been understood and seen through the things God has made." Romans 1:20 is a good reason to go camping and to send our children to church camps.

However, there are large numbers of people who believe in God but want nothing to do with the Church. They believe in God, but they either feel no need for the Church or they just don't believe that God would use the Church for anything good. They believe that God speaks to them better through creation. They experience the glory of God more clearly through a sunrise than through a worship service. They experience the presence of God in the night sky more powerfully than through a Bible study.

However, although creation does a better job than the Church in bearing witness to the power and majesty of God, creation does not do such a great job communicating God's love and mercy. Creation's law is the survival of the fittest. There is no mercy, grace, or salvation for sinners there. When it comes to speaking of God's love, the Church does a much better job than creation because the Church is the only one telling the story of Jesus. John 1:17 says, "The Law was given through Moses. Grace and truth came through Jesus Christ."

The Church is the only one sharing the story of God's love and grace in Jesus. The Church may not always do a great job telling the story, but there is no one else telling the story of Jesus for children, for those who've never heard, and for those who know it best and yet are hungering and thirsting to hear it like the rest.

Some have been turned off by the Church. Ironically, some judge the Church for being judgmental and hate the Church for being "haters." Those who expect the Church to be perfect are disappointed to find that the Church is made up of sinners.

A former church member said, "I don't go to Church anymore. The Church is full of hypocrites." How should we respond to such a statement? Maybe one response is to admit that such a charge hurts and to seek clarification. "Are you saying that all church people, including me, are hypocrites? Do you mean a majority are hypocrites? What percentage would you judge to be hypocrites?"

Another response is to say, "It seems that you have been hurt by the Church. As a member of the Church, I am so sorry. Do you want to talk about what happened?"

When someone says, "I can worship God better without the Church," I want to ask, "What does that look like?" I have always found worship on my own to be pretty lonely. I find I need the Church. Without the Church, I miss hearing God's word of forgiveness and grace.

I am so grateful for God's gift of the Church and for all of you in particular. Thanks for being the Church for me, for each other, for our community, and for our world.



MARCH COUNCIL MEETING SUMMARY

The Immanuel Church Council met February 13 with all members present. John Taggs led devotions from John 15:13. March devotions will be led by Joey Hansen.

John Taggs asked for nominations for officers. Vicki moved and Joey seconded the election of the following officers: John Taggs as president, Dave Greve as vice-president, Vicki Strissel as secretary, Joey Hansen as treasurer, Craig Olson and Amy Kaster for Worship/Evangelism Committee, Eric Chipman and Scott Shannon for Fellowship/Education Committee, Rich & Barb Furst and Trent Svendsen for Outreach/Stewardship, and Ken Nielsen and Todd Madsen for Property. Motion carried.

Vicki Strissel, Joey Hansen, Dave Greve, Craig Olson, John Taggs, Eric Chipman, and Rich & Barb Furst volunteered for Sunday morning deacon duties.

Treasurer's Report: January income was \$25,179.69 and expenses were \$24,795.02 leaving a net income of \$384.67 for the month. General fund is \$88,225.55 and Capital Savings is \$68,154.78. Executive Committee recommended to move the remaining balance of the pipe organ project fund into the General Fund for future tuning of the organ. Motion carried.

Worship/Evangelism – Seth Johannsen was able to obtain the hotel/motel tax grant which will reimburse the \$1000 spent on publicity for the organ dedicatory recital. Potluck was attended by about 70 with lots of great food. Recital was well attended by almost 200 people. The committee is still discussing candidates to recruit for music director position.

Fellowship/Education – LYO had a lock-in overnight at the church after the Ash Wednesday with Pastor and Scott Shannon as adult supervision. Thanks to Ken Nielsen for taking down outdoor decorations. Soup suppers will be served beginning Feb. 21. Volunteer sign-ups are posted. Immanuel's Got Talent will be put on hold until next year. Planning an April 14 Old Fashioned Game Night for Immanuel's 110th Anniversary. May 5th will be Senior Baccalaureate Sunday and breakfast will be provided by our committee for seniors and their parents.

Outreach/Stewardship – Mission Partner for March is the local Salvation Army Fund. Food pantry donations for West Central is at 98 pounds for the year so far. TZ Auction is set for March 23rd. Larry Haas and Dave have been busy with the cans and would like to see if there are others who can help. Sharing cupboard is still drawing a lot of traffic to the church. Thanks to Hansen House for their donations.

Property – Plumber has been called for some problems. Garbage Disposal is working but needs to be run occasionally.

Pastor's Report -- Recommended Tony and Taylor Hansen for membership at Immanuel. Still working on the membership directory, updating information and developing photo directory.
