### **IMMANUEL'S INSIGHTS**



May 2025

Dear Friends in Christ,

Ever since I attended a Bible study during my freshman year of college, 2 Corinthians has been my favorite book of the Bible. In his second letter to the Church in Corinth, the apostle Paul bared his soul. He was trying to rescue this congregation from false teachers who were leading them away from the Gospel.

And the false Gospel in Corinth sounds a lot like popular American Christianity today. We are surrounded by a health and wealth gospel. It is a gospel that says if you have enough faith, you can do anything you want. The Corinthian Christians were tempted to buy into the gospel of success and power. But as Paul noted in his letter, God works through our brokenness and weakness.

Many Christians today have an idealized view of the first generation of Christians. They worked so many miracles. They saw so many people come to faith. Their congregations were so on fire. Or so we have imagined, but the reality was quite different. In 2 Corinthians, the apostle Paul is incredibly honest about his own weaknesses and struggles. He talks about his anxieties for the Church in the first century. He talks about his suffering as an apostle. He warns us about so-called "super apostles" who have great success stories, but really are just in the business of religion for their own egos.

Many today have noted that the Church is in decline in the United States. We have problems like apathy and false teaching and hypocrisy. But the first-generation Church had all those same problems. The truth is that we are living in a great time to be the Church. We have all kinds of resources and support from brothers and sisters in faith from the past and the present day. We have all kinds of evidence of the reality of the power of the Gospel of Jesus to save sinners. We have great resources and freedom to share the Gospel with the world.

We just need to be honest with each other and with the world about our weakness. God doesn't need our strength. God has plenty of strength. What God needs is our weakness, so that people can see the Gospel of Jesus is not for the powerful but for the humble.

This summer, we will be reading through 2 Corinthians together as a church at worship. I believe that we will find it very encouraging for life in the world today.

# APRIL COUNCIL MEETING SUMMARY

The Immanuel Council met April 8 with 10 of 12 members present. John Taggs led devotions from C.S. Lewis' "Screwtape Letters." Craig Olson will lead devotions in May.

Todd Madsen, Kirk Jacobsen, John Taggs, Joey Hansen, Dave Greve, Trent Svendsen, and Scott Shannon volunteered for deacon duties.

**Treasurer's Report:** March income was \$30,858 and expenses were \$39,380 including \$12,445 for insurance and \$2621 for utilities. General Fund balance is at \$69,947 with an additional \$25,000 in a CD. Capital Savings account is \$81,075.

**Fellowship/Education –** VBS was moved to June 10-12. Ages were expanded to 3-years old up through 6<sup>th</sup> grade. Looking for adult and youth staff. Sessions will be 9:00 to noon.

**Outreach/Stewardship** – March mission grant was \$3000 to LCMC Asian Ministries in support of our partners in Myanmar after the earthquake. April mission grant was \$3,000 divided between Riverside Lutheran Bible Camp and Ingham/Okoboji Lutheran Bible Camp. May mission grant will be \$3,000 divided between 3 LCMC-affiliated seminaries (ILT, Luther House, and St. Paul).

**Property:** First estimate on repairing the sewer line is \$30,000. Looking for a second estimate. The south parking lot could use resurfacing and should be done with a sewer line repair. Ken and Todd fixed the broken lock on the front door.

**Executive**: Bid for AC and heating for 3 rooms in education wing was \$16,889. The 2 outside units would be able to handle 4 rooms. Motion and second to go with the project for 4 rooms (childcare, all purpose, new library, and youth rooms) with AC and heat.

**Old Business:** Joey set up a monitor for camera system in the administrator's office.

**New Business**: Question was asked about Overflowing Blessings. Pastor explained that it is not meant to compete with our ILC/Kidugala partnership. Overflowing Blessings is an independent organization founded by member and non-members of Immanuel to use resources outside Immanuel and to support projects outside Kidugala. Some grants cannot go to churches. Some requests for assistance are beyond the scope of our partnership in Kidugala.
