

# **Congregational Meeting – November 22**

The Immanuel Church Council has called for an annual meeting on Sunday, November 22, at 10 AM immediately following the Sunday morning worship service in the sanctuary. There will be no Sunday School classes that morning. The only item of business will be consideration of a revision of the Immanuel Lutheran Church constitution. A quorum of 28 voting members is needed.

Dear Friends in Christ,

A couple of years ago, it was suggested at an annual meeting that we should review our constitution to see if any updates were needed. The main concern was that the church council was too large. We had already downsized from 16 to 14 members on the council, but it still seemed too large. Also, our constitution was 28 pages long and in need of some simplification. And finally, the constitution had language that reflected the structure and practices of the ELCA rather than our current association in LCMC. So a team of 5 (Vicki Carstens, Kayla Jacobs, Craig Olson, John Taggs, and myself) went to work studying our constitution and



other LCMC constitutions. We made no changes to the chapter on "Confession of Faith". What Immanuel believes and teaches has not changed. We did, however, find some things that we believed could be improved.

- 1. We simplified and cut out extra wording to reduce the text of the constitution from 28 to 18 pages. We removed chapters on "Nature of the Church" and "Property Ownership" as unnecessary leftovers from our history in the ELCA.
- 2. We simplified the Statement of Purpose to focus on the Great Commission in Matthew 28 and on Luther's Small Catechism explanation to the third article of the Creed. Our purpose is simply to make disciples of Jesus by calling, gathering, enlightening, and sanctifying for service.
- 3. We updated language on Communion participation to allow freedom to welcome younger children to the sacrament and to reflect Luther's language in the Small Catechism. We have already begun to do this, but now it is clearly explained how.
- 4. We downsized the Church Council from 14 to 12 members with 3-year terms instead of 2-year terms. The congregation will elect 4 members each year to the council and then the council will elect its own officers and committee representatives for each year. Last year the nominating committee had to replace 7 members (half of the church council). This change will mean that the nominating committee can focus on finding no more than 4 candidates for church council each year.
- 5. We added bylaws to address complaints against a pastor. Not that we are expecting complaints, but there was no clear process for dealing with conflict. In LCMC we don't have a bishop to tell us what to do.
- 6. We reduced council committees from 6 to 5 by combining the Fellowship and Education committees. This enabled us to reduce the council to 12 members while still keeping 2 council people on each committee. Hopefully the new Fellowship and Education committee can recruit enough people to take care of both areas of our ministry.
- 7. We changed terms on the Trust and Memorial Committee from two 3-year terms to a single 5year term. This will help with continuity as only one new member will be added to the committee each year.

In order to amend the constitution, we need two congregational votes. Our first one will be November 22 at 10:00 AM. If the proposal passes at the November meeting a ratifying vote will be held at our annual congregational meeting in January. Immanuel has been blessed with good leaders and good organization. I think that these small changes will help us continue that tradition into the future.

### COUNCIL MEETING SUMMARY October 13, 2020—7 pm

The Immanuel Church Council met October 13 with 11 of 14 members present by video conferencing. Steve Allen shared devotions about our problem pebbles vs. God's oceans of grace. Becky Chipman will share devotions in November.

Steve Allen, John Taggs, and Kayla Jacobs will continue to cover council duties at our worship services.

Treasurer reported September income of \$15,983 and September expenses of \$17,866. Year to date income is \$202,724 (which is slightly ahead of 2019). Year to date expenses are \$179,818. Our general fund account ended September at about \$49,400. Our capital project savings are at \$24,532. Tanzania Projects Fund is at \$9,374. Thanks to all who have continued to support the ministry of Immanuel.

**Outreach** – Immanuel has given 1,069 pounds to the County Food Pantry. October Mission Partner is the new LC (Life Care) Clinic opening up in Atlantic. TZ Team will be making pies for the Tanzania projects on Saturday, November 14. All help is welcome.

**Worship** – Discussed how to organize worship services and communion on Christmas Eve. We will encourage volunteers to sign up to help with Scripture reading, Communion prep, and coffee fellowship.

**Education** – Discussed COVID mitigation and Sunday School. Postcard will be sent out to parents regarding Sunday School. There is no way to do Immanuel Kids Club right now. Perhaps we can do a Christmas program by filming small groups to create a video program.

**Property** – The new custodian, Slava Aleev has begun work. Volunteers have helped with edging the sidewalks, watering trees, and tending flowers. Discussed finding someone to wax fellowship hall floors. Greg Nelson will take care of snow removal on sidewalks. Help is needed to remove snow from in front of the doors.

**Executive** – Employee reviews were held. Committee recommends a 3% pay raise and council approved. At Pastor's request committee recommended giving pastor 2 weeks additional vacation this year. Council approved 1 week paid and 1 week unpaid additional vacation. Council approved cancelling the Saturday evening service on November 7 when Pastor is out of town. November 8 service will be led by Sam Jacobs. Joan Wehr will continue on summer hours (9:00 to 1:30) indefinitely. Committee will begin the search for a new office administrator so that Joan will have an opportunity to train her replacement before she retires next spring. The Council approved setting the first vote on the proposed constitution for Sunday, November 22, immediately following the worship service. The necessary quorum is 28 members. There will be no Sunday School on November 22. **Pastor** – Pastor recommended Jennifer Plumb for membership. Council approved.

**SECRETARY'S REPORT:** Minutes from the last meeting in March were reviewed. There being no corrections, Kathy moved to accept the minutes. Myrna seconded. Motion carried.

TREASURER'S REPORT: The WOW Lenten supper potato bar Mar 11 was the last Lenten service before the U.S. shutdown. Fifty-two people were served. Several people purchased the leftover food. Thanks to all who assisted in any way or donated money for expenses. The potato bar income was \$197.05. Receipt of \$192 for quilting a quilt. Kathy reported the March ending balance at \$2569.86.

In August a donation was received from the Verda Larsen family. Due to the Harvest Bazaar being canceled it was decided to request donations through a Bakeless Bake Sale event. Suggested donation was for an amount normally spent purchasing/baking goods and items at the Harvest Bazaar. \$975 was donated by 22 individuals noted in the August Treasurer's Report. Another \$270 by 7 individuals has been received but not yet deposited so will be in a future report. Funeral lunch/meals are not being served by the church women during this pandemic. Bill of \$15.90 paid to Fareway for ingredients for tossed salad for Jacobsen funeral. August ending balance is \$3543.96.

<u>CORRESPONDENCE:</u> A Thank You was received from parents of a child who received assistance from the funds provided to the "Kids At Risk" program. A Thank You also received from the Pattison's for the cards sent by WOW members. Others reported phone calls from those receiving cards as well. Thank You's on narthex bulletin board.

**<u>KITCHEN:</u>** The mats in the kitchen need to be cleaned again. Since no activity in the kitchen for months, the dishwasher and sink drains need to be flushed out to eliminate odor.

**COMMUNITY:** Sharon reported we should continue the WOW cards being sent. Fall "Goodie Bags" were discussed. It was decided to have prepared bags at the Oct 14 WOW Gathering and deliver afterwards leaving on doorsteps.
