Dear Friends in Christ,



Thank you to those of you who provided both positive and critical feedback on my letter in the October Insights. It is good to know that people do read my monthly efforts. I do tend to be a middle of the road kind of person who can see good and evil on both sides of a conflict. I think that comes from having spent so much time teaching the Ten Commandments section of the Small Catechism.

I want to give a brief report on the 2025 LCMC Annual Gathering that DeAnn, Craig, Becky, and I attended. The gathering focused on a celebration of the 25th anniversary of the formation of LCMC. We heard from some of the founding members of our association. LCMC was formed in 2001 by congregations that wanted to resist a move toward hierarchy among Lutherans. Beginning in 2009 there was rapid growth from congregations joining that wanted to resist a move away from Scripture regarding sexuality. And since 2020 growth in LCMC has come from congregations that are desperate to find pastors.

There was some discussion about the growing shortage of pastors across the Church including LCMC. It is exciting to hear the quality of the young pastors coming into LCMC, but they are not enough to keep up with the retirement tsunami. Every congregation was encouraged to recruit young people to serve at our Bible Camps and to consider seminary.

We heard a message from our retiring LCMC service coordinator, Mike Bradley, and a message from our new service coordinator, Julie Smith. Several important points were made about the future of LCMC.

- 1. Congregations need a little help once in a while. The easiest response is to build a bureaucracy or hierarchy so that members don't have to respond to the needs of their neighbors. LCMC calls congregations to be there for one another as partners in the Gospel together. If you want to go fast, go alone, but if you want to go far, go together.
- 2. Theology doesn't take care of itself. LCMC congregations have the freedom to call as pastors whomever they see fit to serve. That does not mean that theology is unimportant. The Gospel is not self-evident. The Gospel is salvation not for the worthy but for the needy, not for the religious but for sinners. We are constantly tempted to trade it in for something that makes sense to us. We are not preaching moralism or self-improvement which are the popular messages of today. Our culture is all about winning. The Gospel calls us to follow Jesus who laid down his life for us.

Next year's Annual Gathering will be in Des Moines. It will be another great opportunity to experience the joy of being part of Lutheran Congregations in Mission for Christ.



OCTOBER COUNCIL MEETING SUMMARY

The Immanuel Council met October 14 with 7 of 12 members present. Craig Olson led devotions from a devotional by Martin Luther. November devotions will be led by John Taggs.

Vicki Strissel, Todd Madsen, Kirk Jacobsen, and John Taggs volunteered for December council duties.

Treasurer's Report: September income was \$42,476 (highest for 2025) including \$9580 for refugee food relief. September expenses were \$18,536. September YTD income is \$237,967 and YTD expenses are \$204,687. General Fund balance is \$130,257. Capital Savings balance is at \$84,262. Tanzania Account is at \$61,861.

Worship/Evangelism: We have been asked to host a Christmas concert with Rachel Scott and band. Council agreed to see if a date can be arranged.

Stewardship/Outreach: September Mission Partner grant went to an LCMC congregation in Kodiak, Alaska. October Mission Partner grant will to go LCMC partners in former Communist countries in Eastern Europe including Estonia and Ukraine.

Property: All 7 fire extinguishers in our buildings have been replaced. We have individuals leading the project of furnishing the new library and we have a volunteer to lead the painting and furnishing of the new childcare corner in the narthex. We will make a recommendation about the sewer line project at the 2026 Annual Congregational meeting.

Executive: We had a request for exterior door keys for the school to use in emergency evacuations. John will look into getting more exterior door keys made. John and Kirk will have employee interviews with Pastor, Diane, and Slava. Discussed reaction to pastor's column in the September newsletter.

Old Business: We have a donor for a new computer in the chapel. We will purchase it from Lightbox.

New Business: We had a request for space for an ESL tutor to use for his classes. John will look into insurance liability issues.
