

IMMANUEL'S INSIGHTS





I have enjoyed walking with you through 1 Corinthians this past summer. Beginning this month we are scheduled to hear from the great prophets of the Old Testament: Isaiah, Jeremiah, Ezekiel, and others. The prophets were preachers who called God's people to faithfulness to God. They preached both warnings of judgment and promises of renewal. The prophets were critical of Israel's idolatry and greed which they called spiritual adultery. They were hated by the powerful and the popular. Many of them suffered for their preaching.

I imagine the prophets of Israel wouldn't be any better off in America today. They would be accused of mixing religion and politics. But for the prophets, faithfulness to God included issues of economic justice and political righteousness. Justice is giving people what they deserve as God's beloved creations. Righteousness is living in relationships of honor and peace. The prophets of the Old Testament didn't have to vote. But they were rarely fans of those in power. They called everyone, including the kings, to the ways of justice and peace.

I have always believed it is my Christian duty to vote. To fail to vote would be to dishonor the blessing of citizenship in a free nation and the sacrifices of those who died to secure that right for us. At the same time, when one is not given decent choices to vote for, can abstaining from voting also be a way to honor our freedom?

We can't expect our candidates to be perfect. But is it too much to expect candidates to respect the outcome of our elections and to not speak of people in dehumanizing ways? Is it too much to expect candidates to answer questions without talking in meaningless "word salads" and to have some sense of respect for the life of unborn children?

I will probably vote, but I can respect those who will vote for the opposing candidate. There is nothing easy about voting. Everybody in the media thinks it is an easy choice, either for one candidate or the other. They think undecided voters are ignorant. They are wrong.

The real tragedy of the current American political climate has been the politicization of the Church. When preachers take cheap shots at Trump, they are telling Republicans they are not welcome in the Church. When preachers take cheap shots at Harris, they are telling Democrats that they are not welcome in the Church. Either way, Jesus, the friend of sinners, weeps.

When we read the gospels, it's clear Jesus was not here to win elections. He refused attempts to politicize his mission and his message. He spoke the truth in ways that offended both liberals and conservatives. His calls for justice and compassion and for honesty and humility are critical of our whole political climate.

What this world needs is NOT Christians with the correct political views. What this world needs is Christians who act like Jesus. Sinners looking for hope won't really care about our political positions as much as they will care if we act like Jesus, with honesty and understanding, with passion for justice and the patience of peace.

When we get a snapshot (in John 17) of Jesus praying for the future church, what is Jesus most concerned about? Not theological (or ideological) purity, as important as that may be. His number one concern was unity. Our mission is to love others as God in Christ loved us. It isn't easy. But in this divisive and polarized climate, how we follow Jesus is far more important than our political opinions.

SEPTEMBER COUNCIL MEETING SUMMARY

The Immanuel Church Council met September 10 with 9 of 13 members present. Joey Hansen led devotions on Philippians 4:6-7 and anxiety. October devotions will be led by John Taggs. Dave, Joey, Vicki, John, and Todd volunteered for Sunday morning deacon duties.

Treasurer's Report: September income was \$16,943 and expenses were \$25,259 leaving us with a net loss for 2024 YTD of \$2,729. VBS expense was \$1,658. General Fund is at \$89,866 and Capital Reserve is at \$75,312.

Worship/Evangelism Report: Bell Choir met with 12 ringers. They will plan to perform several times this year. Volunteers will direct.

Fellowship/Education Report: We have seen growth in our youth programming this fall. JAM has had 10. GROW has had 15. Confirmation has had 17. LYO has had 15.

Stewardship/Outreach Report: September Mission Partner is the Lutheran Church of South Sudan. Pastor Jordan Long will be our guest speaker September 28-29.

Property Report: Window for the sanctuary has been installed. Now we need to decide what to do about the decorative shade covers. Carpet cleaning has been scheduled for October. We are on the job list for the cameras and WiFi installation. We will clean out the junk room after harvest.

Executive Report: Nominating Committee includes John Taggs, Joey Hansen, Verne Nelson, Kirk Jacobsen, and Sherry Lytle.






