## **Fall Educational Programs**

Jesus gave the Church a mission: make disciples or followers of Jesus. The Church is a school for discipleship. We continue to offer Sunday morning Adult Bible Class from 10:15 to 11:00 a.m. This fall we are reading through the Gospel of John. All are welcome. Our popular Women's Bible Study will meet this month on Wednesday afternoons beginning September 20. They are continuing a study of the Gospel of Matthew. And the Men's Bible study (otherwise known as Steve Allen's class) will start up again to eat snacks and view and discuss "The Chosen" on Thursday evenings beginning September 21.

High School students are encouraged to join us for LYO (Lutheran Youth Organization). We meet together every Wednesday evening that school is in session from 6:30 to 8:00 p.m. for a meal, conversations, games, other activities, sharing of highs and lows, and prayer.

The 3-year confirmation program will meet every Wednesday that school is in session from 5:15 to 6:15 p.m. for students in grades 6, 7, and 8. 6<sup>th</sup> graders will study an overview of the Bible with Dr. Allen and Dr. Olson. 7<sup>th</sup> graders will study the Ten Commandments and the Lord's Prayer with Dr. Brelje. 8<sup>th</sup> graders will study the Apostles Creed and the Sacraments with Pastor Nielsen.

GROW (God Rocks our Wednesdays) is for 3<sup>rd</sup> through 5<sup>th</sup> grade students every Wednesday that school is in session from 3:30 to 5:00 p.m. We spend 3 years having fun while learning about the books of the Bible.

JAM (Jesus and Me) is for 3-year olds through 2<sup>nd</sup> grade students and they meet Sunday mornings after the children's message at worship for 40 minutes of learning about Jesus. JAM begins Sunday, September 17.

### HOMECOMING SUNDAY

Homecoming Sunday or Rally Sunday is Sunday, September 24. We are planning a special program after worship to highlight the educational programs of Immanuel. You may be surprised by all that we are doing to make disciples. After the program there will be a pork dinner tailgate party on the parking lot and games for the children (and adults?)

### **IMMANUEL'S INSIGHTS**





Dear Friends in Christ,

This is an amazing time to be a Christian. There are great challenges to our faith. But there are also amazing blessings that we can receive from our fellow Christians all over the globe. I have found a sweet blessing in a television production called "The Chosen."

"The Chosen" is breaking new ground in television programming in several ways. One is the way it is funded. It is being crowd-sourced, that is, its funding is coming from donations. Costing more than \$1 million per episode, "The Chosen" is high quality television, and yet it is being funded strictly by donations and sales of merchandise. And secondly, it is ground-breaking in the way it is being distributed. You can watch all the episodes simply by going to a website on your computer, phone, or smart TV. It is free for anyone with a connection to the internet. You don't have to have a streaming service or pay to view it.

I have seen many movie productions based on the life of Jesus. One of my favorites is the NIV Visual Bible Gospel of Matthew which at over 4 hours long uses only the words of the Gospel of Matthew. But "The Chosen" is unlike anything I have ever seen before.

And it is all right there in the title. "The Chosen." Who is the Chosen or who are the Chosen? I don't think it refers to Jesus. The Chosen are the followers of Jesus. And "The Chosen" is really about them. Yes, Jesus is the main character, but he doesn't even show up until the very end of episode one. "The Chosen" really focuses on the followers of Jesus: Peter, Andrew, Mary, Matthew, and the rest.

In most movies based on the gospels, the disciples are a forgettable bunch of characters that we never really get to know. You can hardly tell them apart. But "The Chosen" tells the story of Jesus from the perspective of the disciples. We get to know the disciples as real human people.

In most movies based on the gospels, you might get the impression that Jesus chose his followers because they were a cut above the average person. But the gospels tell us that the disciples were prone to argue with each other and were rife with jealousies and rivalries. "The Chosen" shows us what it might have really been like to be among those bickering disciples.

The four gospels are very sparse in their descriptions of the life of Jesus. They don't give us many details or background. Parchment was expensive and they didn't have the space to give great detail to the life of Jesus. And so we are left to fill in the details and imagine the background.

A good friend of mine who is a Lutheran pastor disagrees with me about seeing "The Chosen." He argues that we shouldn't let a movie fill in the blanks of the gospels. If the gospels don't tell us the details, we don't need to know those details or that background.

But don't we all fill in the blanks in our own minds as we hear the stories? Don't we imagine the visual details of the stories? Don't we imagine the body language, the tone of voice, and the subtexts under the narrative? If you spend any time meditating on the narratives of the gospel, you have filled in the blanks in your own mind. You can't help but do it.

The problem is that much of our imagination about the gospels tends toward Docetism, pietism, and sentimentality. Docetism was an ancient heresy in the church that is still around today. Docetism downplayed the humanity of Jesus and imagined that Jesus was really divine and only seemed to be human. I think a lot of Hollywood movies about Jesus portrayed a Docetic Jesus. Pietism and sentimentality imagine that the disciples and other characters of the Bible were more saints than sinners. The Roman Church and American fundamentalists always interpret characters in the Bible as having holy motivations as if they were near perfect.



But the truth is that Jesus chose his disciples **NOT** because they were a cut above everybody else. Jesus chose his disciples because they were just like all of us. We see that clearly in "The Chosen."

I haven't agreed with all the interpretive choices made by the screen writers of "The Chosen." I think they misinterpreted Jesus' parable of the dragnet. I don't think Jesus had Matthew give him a critique of his sermon on the mount. But I have enjoyed the way that "The Chosen" has challenged some of my sentimental, pietistic, and even Docetic imaginings of the gospels. I love the way "The Chosen" brings out the Jewishness of Jesus and his disciples. I love the way "The Chosen" shows us the humanity of Jesus who is hungry, thirsty, tired, humorous, playful, and fierce. He is not some solemn mystic who stares into space and speaks in churchy tones as he has sometimes been portrayed.

So was Matthew autistic? Was Peter having tax troubles? Perhaps not, but they had their own baggage when Jesus called them. Better to imagine Jesus' followers with baggage than to imagine that Jesus called them because they were already on the way to sainthood.

The episode about the call of Mary Magdalene is pure imagination. All Luke tells us is that Jesus delivered Mary from some kind of demonic oppression. The way it is told in "The Chosen" is so beautiful and powerful that I could watch it again and again. The episode about the wedding in Cana is a beautiful attempt to explain why Jesus turned the water into wine when he just told his mother that it was not the right time. More often than not, I finish an episode of "The Chosen" and I want to talk about it. It makes me wonder about things in the Gospel that I haven't wondered about before.

I am not a fan of a lot of Christian movies and television. They often miss the mark theologically for me. But I have been very impressed with the first two seasons of "The Chosen." Currently there are 3 seasons of 8 episodes each. I've heard that there are plans for at least 7 seasons. And if you want to talk about it, I'm always up for a conversation about the gospels.

### AUGUST COUNCIL MEETING SUMMARY

The Immanuel Church Council met August 8 with 12 of 13 members present. Steve Allen led devotions from Isaiah 43:1. Eric Chipman will share devotions in September.

**Treasurer**: July income was \$17,369 and expenses were \$18,110. General Fund at the end of July was \$52,620. Building Fund balance was \$62,008.

**Worship/Evangelism:** We had to replace the remote controller for the sanctuary screens and projectors. The age of our projectors suggests that we may need to replace one or more in the near future. Suggestions to allow for silent prayer during worship was discussed. We need a few more members of the Worship/Evangelism committee. We also need some new sound and video tech volunteers. Training is available.

The pipe organ may be removed in mid-September and returned by Christmas. It was decided to paint the balcony ceiling tiles to provide better resonance for the organ. There was also discussion about removing the front 3 pews in the balcony to make more room for music performance. That suggestion was tabled.

**Fellowship/Education:** VBS had 52 children (13 were from ILC member families). Okoboji staff were outstanding. Our 6 youth volunteer helpers were outstanding. The kitchen help was outstanding. Thanks to DeAnn Nielsen and Sheila Mills for teaching the preschoolers. The cost was about \$1800. The Okoboji staff said our kids were outstanding, but we already knew that. Smore church was cancelled due to extreme heat, but we had good attendance at the VBS program. Fall programming begins Wednesday, September 6. Dr. Tim Brelje will teach his last year of confirmation for us. JAM starts September 17. Rally Sunday is September 24.

**Outreach/Stewardship:** Our September Mission Partners are GoServe Global and LC Clinic (\$1000 each). 591 lbs. of food to the Pantry.

**Property**: We had 35 people helping at our yard clean-up party. Thanks to everybody.

**Executive:** We hired Pastor Keith Menter as our choir director. Rehearsals will be on Sunday mornings beginning September 10. Sharon Davidson will continue as accompanist. Bell choir is still on hold at this time.

### TANZANIA HAPPENINGS


