The request went out to start looking for the sight with the most need for water in the Kidugala region. Pastor Wallace got back to us the next day saying that the regional hospital at llembula needs water badly and that they could get started! We have visited this hospital and we pass by it on most trips to Kidugala. After the testing was complete on Saturday they successfully drilled a deep well on Tuesday! Now the pump, tower and pipe may take months to finish, but the well has been drilled to 165 meters and is producing good quality and a good quantity of water. Stay tuned. Bwana Asifiwe!
