

GRADUATION 2024

Great news! The Trinity Lutheran Seminary, and the Trinity Lutheran College graduation ceremonies in July honored 312 students. These two institutions belong to the Lutheran Church of South Sudan, a refugee church body whose members took refuge in the countries bordering South Sudan because of the civil strife that claimed hundreds of thousand of lives in the last eleven years.


Over the last eight years, the college graduated 3,600 students. Many of these graduates have found jobs in Ethiopia and in South Sudan and have become productive members of society. The LCSS through its seminary, has also trained, graduated, ordained and sent 95 pastors over the same period. St. Matthew writes, "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few; therefore pray earnestly to the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest" (Matthew 37-38). The LCSS has 317 congregations and a little over 130 pastors. The LCSS is grateful to all partners who walk with us to train these pastors. Your benevolences have enabled the LCSS to fill pulpits with pastors and to spread the Gospel.

The LCSS has also celebrated the completion of the Itang School project. Itang is a town just outside the refugee camp. It is located about 20 miles west of the Gambella town. It is difficult for the refugee students to travel to Gambella for college education.

As a result, the LCSS has received donations and built a six classroom building in Itang to accommodate the refugee students, drilled a well for clean drinking water, and furnished the classrooms with chairs. We give praise and glory to God for the completion of these projects and for the generosity of the donors.

BOOKS FOR AFRICA

A long awaited project is happening as we print this newsletter. A container of books, both religous for Trinity Seminary and medical for Trinity College are on a boat in the Atlantic Ocean, headed for Ethiopia. These books will be invaluable to the mission of the Lutheran Church of South Sudan. The Word of God never changes; so the religous books will be helpful for decades. The medical books are a slightly different item. Medicine changes all the time with scientific advancement. Improved knowledge will almost certainly help save lives of our brothers and sisters in Africa. Thanks to all who helped make this project reality.

LIBRARY

A library to house the books is needed. The heat and humidity in Ethiopia will destroy the books. The average high temperature in the warm season is 105 degrees. The average high in the "cool" season is 95 degrees. An air conditioned space is needed. A library addition is planned to be added to the building housing the chapel. Estimated price tag is \$24,000, with furnishings. Again, prices in the third world are so much less than here in North America. We have a lead gift of \$7500 from Divine Shepherd Lutheran Church of Omaha. Our thanks to Rev. Jim Rasmussen, for leading this effort at Divine Shepherd. We are accepting donations at this time. We have included an envelope for this purpose, if you would like to donate. For those who have already given to this project, we thank you.
